



GREENHOUSE TO BE BUILT

Issuance of a permit to E. E. Holman to build a one-story greenhouse, to cost \$5000, in Old Town, was the high light of building activity in La Grande.

Several other permits, making a total of 17825, were issued by City Recorder J. E. Stearns.

The permits follow:

July 19—Permit issued to George E. Walker to alter and repair a home on Spruce between Monroe and S. work to cost \$200.

July 19—Permit issued to Emma Springham to alter and repair a one and a half story building on M between Sixth and Seventh, work to cost \$2000.

July 19—Permit issued to Clyde Harrison to erect a garage on W between Fir and Greenwood to cost \$100.

July 23—Permit issued to C. W. Chandler to alter and repair a dwelling on Third between Adams and Jefferson, work to cost \$25.

July 24—Permit issued to E. E. Holman to erect a one-story steel and glass greenhouse on A between Oak and Cedar, to cost \$5000.

July 24—Permit issued to C. D. Goodenough to alter and repair a dwelling on L between First and Second, work to cost \$500.

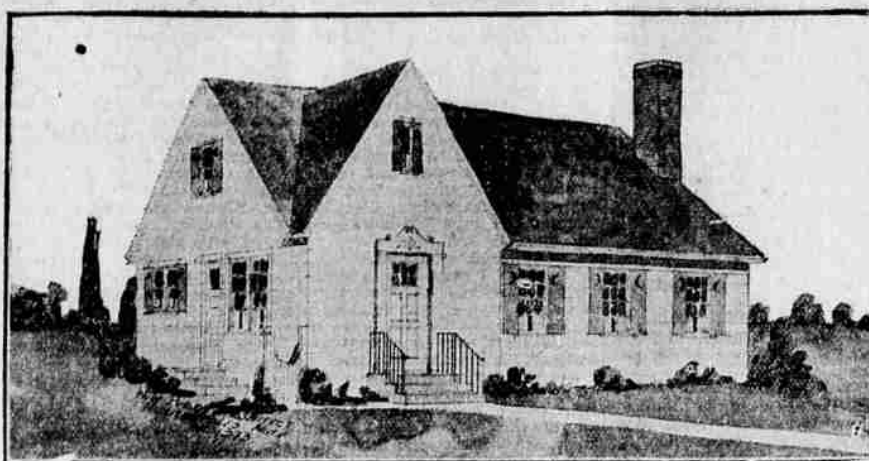

Expect More Building In U. S. Than Last Year

WASHINGTON, July 26.—Recent developments in the construction industry virtually assure fulfillment of forecasts that the amount of building operations to be handled this year will be as great or greater than the record-breaking volume established in 1925.

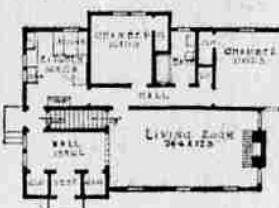
The total volume of contracts awarded during the first five months of 1926 exceeded by 14 percent the figure for the corresponding period of 1925, according to statistics compiled by the Associated General Contractors of America. The total number of building permits issued during the first five months of this year is only slightly below the mark set in the same months of 1925.

While the volume of contracts awarded and the number of permits issued during May both were somewhat lower than the levels reached in April, the actual amount of construction under way in June set a new record for that month. This June figure was only slightly below the highest mark on record for any month and promises to be exceeded in July.

Simplicity is the keynote of this design. Void of any ornamentation the steep pitch of the roof and the attractive Colonial treatment of the entrance door has caused many a passerby to pause and admire this little cottage.

A brick soldier course at grade, wide siding painted white, dark green shutters and blinds, is used most effectively. Note the simple brick entrance stoop and iron hand rail.

Let us enter this attractive little home; not so little after all, with two good bed rooms and bath off a hall, kitchen and dining alcove. A stairway leads to the second floor, where an additional bed room can be finished off if desired.

There is a full basement where a large amusement room is located under the living room, with an additional fireplace, usual laundry, fruit and vegetable room, storage and furnace room.

The plans call for hardwood floors throughout, linoleum in the kitchen with tile in bath, with pine trim, enameled. The walls are tinted, and the Colonial lighting fixtures make the effect unusually pleasing.

Finished as described, this home should be built for from \$5000 to \$6500, exclusive of heating and plumbing.

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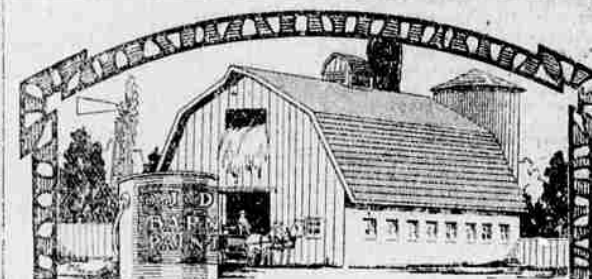
