(By Sister Mary)

Breakfast—Stirred cherries, crisp broiled bacon, scrambled eggs, whole wheat pop-over, milk, coffee.

Luncheon—Chocolate egg drink, whole wheat bread and butter sandwiches, baked apples, nut cookies.

Dinner—Baked meat and vegetable hash, head lettuce with Roquefort cheese dressing, graham bread, sour cream pie, milk, coffee.

The chief source of nourishment in the luncheon menu is found in the "drink." The sandwiches and baked apple furnish bulk and satisfy hunger.

Baked Meat and Vegetable Hash
One-half pound round steak ground, 2 cups finely diced carrots, 2 cups finely diced potatoes, 3 medium sized onions, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon pepper, 1/2 cup dried bread crumbs, 1 cup milk, 1 tablespoon butter, 4 tablespoons buttered crumbs.

Mix meat and dried bread crumbs thoroughly. The vegetables can be put through the coarse knife of the food chopper but the dish is rather nicer if the vegetables are chopped. Combine vegetables with meat mixture. Season with salt and pepper and stir in milk and butter. Put into a well buttered baking dish. Cover with buttered crumbs. Cover dish and bake in a slow oven for one hour. Remove cover for last fifteen minutes of baking to brown crumbs. Serve in the baking dish.

Farm Pointers

Corn is the best Oregon silage crop where it does well, says the experiment station. The early maturing varieties are among the most productive feed crops. It is good for hogging off in summer and fall as well as for feed in other forms. And it is a much needed intertilled crop in Oregon farm management.

Strong livable chicks are not produced in Oregon from hatching stock that is immature, under fed, over fat, or low vitality, forced for high egg yield, or kept in close confinement away from direct sunlight, says the experiment station. The breeding stock needs open range and sunlight for a month before the eggs are used for incubation.

Applying commercial lead arsenate to stone fruits in Oregon has some danger of burn, the experiment station points out. Neutral or triplumbe lead is to be preferred but nearly impossible to get. Serious burns on the stone fruits from lead arsenate are rare, and appreciable burns uncommon.

Artificial swarming of bees in Oregon may be resorted to, says the college extension service, when bees persist in their desire to swarm, or when hive preparations such as capped queen cells have gone so far that prevention seems doubtful. When moderate increase is not undesirable this method satisfies the swarming instinct of the bees and may be brought on at a convenient time.

Superficial curbers of pear and apple trees in Oregon are generally induced through infection courts such as rotch cracks, frost cracks, leaf scars and scab infections of the bark, reports the experiment station. Although the curbers enter through such courts it is seldom found on trees whose bark has not suffered at least slight
