DEMPSEY MAY FIGHT IN N. Y.

NEW YORK, July 27 (AP)—The state athletic commission today, by a vote of two to one, approved a proposal to stage the Dempsey-Tunney heavyweight championship match at the Yankee stadium on September 16.

NEW YORK, July 27 (AP)—Tex Rickard and his heavyweight title fight have been invited to return to New York with every prospect that the bout will take place at the Yankee stadium September 16.

George Brower, chairman of the New York State Athletic commission last year, who has stood by the present head of the board, James A. Farley, in the argument that Harry Wills, negro, should have the first chance at Dempsey's crown, invited Rickard to return and Tex, balked at least temporarily in his efforts to stage the event in Chicago, accepted immediately. Farley declared he "stood pat" in opposition to the bout and predicted it would neither be held in New York or anywhere else this year.

COLOrado SPRINGS, Colo., July 27 (AP)—Jack Dempsey, world's heavyweight champion, expressed delight here today upon receipt of word that his fight with Gene Tunney might be staged in New York City.

"It's all right with me if the fight is held in New York," said the champion. "Rickard was having his hands full in Chicago. What I want is to get into the ring and it doesn't matter much where. That's up to Rickard. However, it seems to me New York is the logical place for the bout."

FERGUSONS ECLIPSED BY MOODY

bonds held invalid by the U. S. supreme court. She also said she wished to give the legislature an opportunity to investigate any department of the state government it might wish.

Governor Ferguson's political career began in the spring of 1924 when the state supreme court ruled that her husband, James F. "Farmer Jim" Ferguson was ineligible for the governorship because of his impeachment in 1917. Ferguson then placed his wife's name on the ballot and a "vindication" campaign followed in which she was elected by a record majority. The impeachment followed alleged irregularities in office including a charge that he placed state funds in his own bank.

Moody, who is 22 years old, is one of the youngest men ever to take the Texas democratic leadership. He was born at Taylor, Williamson county, in June, 1904. When he was 12 his father died and he became an electrician's helper. Money saved from his wages enabled him to attend Texas university and in 1914 he began the practice of law in Taylor.

Elected as Williamson county attorney in 1920, he next was named district attorney for Williamson and Travis counties where his fame in prosecuting Texas logging cases swept him to the attorney generalship two years ago. He soon had arguments with the Fergusons and this spring he announced his candidacy for governor. He was married in April to Miss Mildred Paxton, daughter of an Abilene, Texas, banker. His wife taking an active part in his present campaign.

All of the incumbent 17 democratic representatives of the national congress were renominated as was Harry M. Wurzbach, only republican congressman. A democratic run-off primary will be necessary in the attorney general's and state treasurer's races.

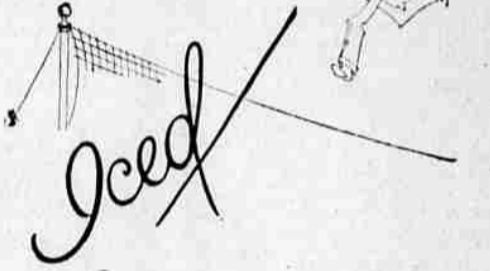
