**KING BORIS TO
WED PRINCESS,
REUTERS SAYS**

LONDON, July 29. (AP)—King
Boris, of Greece, is expected to
be seen from Sofia that the
wedding of King Boris, of Bulgaria,
to Princess Giovanna, third daugh-
ter of the Italian monarch, is
"announced in an authoritative
manner."

King Boris, the only monarch
sovereign in Europe, left Bulgaria
early this morning ostensibly for a
holiday, but it was later estimated
by premier Dragapoff that he was
seeking a bride.

"Every young man of the king's
age (27) naturally desires to meet
his mate," the premier said. "No
doubt definite has been settled in
this regard. The king is abso-
lutely free to act in the matter of his
marriage with his own good will."

There have been no recent
rumors that Boris would seek an
alliance with Princess Giovanna,
who is in her nineteenth year, nar-
rowing the difference in
their ages. The princess is a
member of the Catholic church,
while Boris is of the orthodox be-
lief.

Boris is at present in Safford-
ville. He is traveling incognito,
as "Count Ruzicki" and his move-
ments have been largely kept a
secret. He is not reported to have
visited Rome since leaving Sofia,
although it is known he was at
some of the northern Italian lake
resorts.
