Wool Production Tops Last Year's Figures

WASHINGTON, July 29 (AP)—Wool production this year in the United States was estimated today by the department of agriculture at 269,954,000 pounds, compared with 255,907,000 pounds last year. The average weight a fleece was placed at 7.8 pounds. Production by important wool growing states was estimated as follows: Texas 25,804,000 pounds; Wyoming 24,122,000; Montana 23,109,000; Utah 20,322,000; Idaho 18,440,000; Oregon 18,400,000; California 18,319,000; Arizona 16,044,000; and New Mexico 12,225,000.

PORTLAND, Ore., July 29 (AP)—Cuba butter quotations are higher in the dairy exchange with the entire list up 1/2 to 1c. Extras now at 41 cents; standards 40; prime firsts 22; firsts 26c. Prints and butterfat are firm at the recent advances.

Fresh standard extras and firsts are a cent higher today in the local egg market while current receipts and mediums remain firm at previous levels. Extras now 25c with firsts at 23 cents. Receipts at 22 cents with local buyers paying around 22c for homery receipts.

Country dressed meat arrivals were moderate along the street today and prices generally steady on hogs and calves. Best choice light veal 17 to 17 1/2c with occasional sales as high as 18c. Top selling at 20 to 20 1/2c. Light hens still remain plentiful and weak at 16 cents. Heavy hens in good demand at 26 cents. Dressed receipts not so liberal and prices well maintained especially on colored stock.

Bull Movement Gains Strength in Exchange

NEW YORK, July 29 (AP)—With speculative imagination fired by the sensational advances in General Motors common and United States Steel common which again attained record high levels at 194 1/2 and 149, respectively, this "bull" movement in the stock market broadened out considerably today. Extreme gains of two to six points were recorded by scores of issues despite a rather heavy volume of profit taking and short selling. The closing was irregular. Total sales approximated 2,500,000 shares.

WOOL REPORT
BOSTON, July 29 (AP)—The Commercial Bulletin will say tomorrow: "Rather better demand for wool is reported in the market here this week. Medium wools are in strong position, although somewhat less active at the moment while fine, medium territory wools are in better request. Prices throughout the East are firm and the tendency is if anything against the buyer. In the west, activity is less pronounced but prices are steady."
"The foreign markets are firm. Merinos closed at London generally steady, as compared with the previous sales closing rates, extremely fine wools slightly in favor of buyer, but medium and low cross breeds were against the buyer by par to five per cent, a rather unexpected change and attributed to covering against Russian order."
"The goods market is in better shape. Further repeat orders together with a fair volume of business on the new goods, induced by the general belief that prices are at the bottom, are reported."
"Mohair is very firm."
"The receipts from January 1, 1925 to July 29, 1926, inclusive were 244,114,457 pounds against 199,125,500 pounds for the same period last year."

Sharp Wheat Advance Followed by Setback

CHICAGO, July 29 (AP)—Wheat advanced sharply today, but subsequently free selling to realize profits led to a material setback from the day's top figures. Unfavorable crop weather for wheat in Canada together with much higher quotations at Liverpool, gave a notable stimulus to buyers. Export business today in wheat was estimated at nearly 1,500,000 bushels.
Wheat closed unsettled at the same as yesterday's finish to 3/4c higher, corn 1/2 to 1 1/2c down; oats 1/2 1/2c to 1/2c and provisions showing 7 to 22c advance.
