## Service Will Honor Three Sacraments

### Baptism, Reception of Members, Holy Communion All on South M. E. Church Program

Five small children are to be baptized, several persons will be received into the membership of the denomination and the congregation will join in holy communion at divine worship Sunday morning at the Methodist Church South. Bible school at 9:45 o'clock will precede the service. "Love Made the Supper" will be the subject of a timely sermon by the Rev. J. A. Hall, pastor. The message will be supplemented by congregational and choir singing. Epworth League will meet at 7 p. m., followed by a preaching service at 8 o'clock.
