

TWO COLLEGES BAR DRINKING

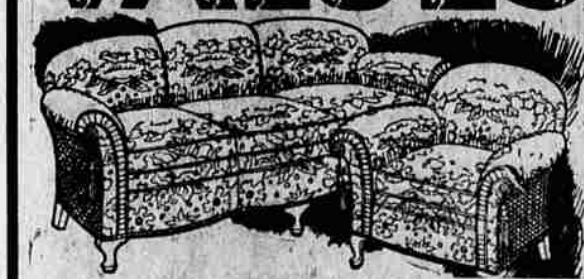
