RURAL TRAFFIC DANGER GROWS

Fatalities Increased 23 Per Cent in 1925—City Conditions Show Improvement.

Rural motor fatalities increased 23 per cent in 1925 according to a survey just completed by the National Automobile chamber of commerce. This is the first national survey which has been made regarding the country—districts from the urban sections, and in the opinion of the automobile chamber it brings to light the necessity for focusing attention on betterment of traffic in the country districts. This rise in motor fatalities in rural sections is much higher than the general average for the country as a whole which has been estimated at 10 per cent.

Autos Show Drop
 While the statistics for the first five months of 1926 show a very slight decrease from last year there are no records to show whether or not the agricultural sections have enjoyed a similar degree of progress. The conditions of the 1925 record are accordingly applicable—the opinion of motor authorities.

Complete records for 1925 were received from 1,434 counties which is 43 per cent of the total. These reported 4,568 fatal motor accidents in 1925 as compared with 5,724 in 1924.

In only six states was there an improvement over the year 1924—Arkansas, Colorado, Minnesota, New Hampshire and Pennsylvania.

City Record for 1926.
 There is a possibility that 1926 will mark the turning of the tide in motor accidents. The records for the larger cities for the first five months indicate a decrease from last year. May, 1926, however, was higher than May, 1925. Cleveland, St. Louis, Boston, San Kansas City, Mo., and Seattle, Wash., are among the cities which have made conspicuous progress in the reduction of accidents.

EXPOSITION IS FACING LOSS OF ABOUT \$100,000,000

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 7. (AP)—Sequelentennial exposition investors face a loss of more than \$100,000,000 and the whole project will be a complete failure if it is not permitted to operate on Sundays, in the opinion of counsel for the sequelentennial association. They so assert in their reply to the state attorney general which seeks to show the association exceeds its charter by remaining open on Sunday.

Maintaining that no merchandise is sold on the ground on Sunday and that no charge is made for the amusements in addition to the 50 cent gate fee, the lawyer declared that the operation of the exposition on Sunday is in strict conformity with all existing laws and that the court is without jurisdiction to compel its closing.

"More than \$100,000,000 has already been invested in this enterprise and the total amount, or almost the entire amount so invested would be lost and the complete failure of this exposition involved in the action prayed for by this reporter."

SOVIET LEADERS QUARREL; ALARM FELT IN RUSSIA

NEW YORK, Aug. 7. (AP)—Differences between soviet leaders have resulted in alarming conditions in the Russian army and navy, according to a dispatch from Tientsin broadcast by the French official wireless station at Bordeaux and picked up by the New York World.

The World quotes the dispatch as saying the soviet commissioner and residents of Moscow are alarmed over the spirit of the fighting services following the circulation of an attack of the present executive committee by Gregory Zinoviev, head of the communist third international. Numerous arrests in Moscow barracks are reported and Mensjinski, the newly appointed chief of the secret police, has been empowered to arrest all communists, "however situated."

Examine Tires Before Starting Trip, Advice

"All motorists, before they embark on a long tour or trip to the country, realize that all the knocks must be eliminated from the motor, but very few realize that since tires do not "knock," so to speak, there are several important points to examine about your tires equally as important as the knocks in the motor, to completely safeguard your enjoyment on the trip," according to the proprietor of the La Grande Tire shop, T. "One of the most simple and often the one always overlooked in the amount of inflation of the tire. Proper inflation is necessary, and every tire dealer is only too glad to supply the motorist with a chart showing him the various recommended inflations for all sizes and kinds of tires. It is also important, he advises, that these rules be carefully considered, since the tire manufacturer had made these recommendations only after the most exhaustive tests under every known riding condition.

"The inflation should be tested approximately every ten days in order to safeguard against under-inflation. Half-ton tires should be watched more closely than high pressure tires since a small loss of air is a greater percentage to the total than in high pressure tires."
