## HIGHWAY WORK PROGRESSING

ENTERPRISE, Ore. Aug. 7. (Special)—A county crew has begun work on the east end of the Innaha market road, near where it leaves the valley highway. The first task is construction of a bridge over a ditch in the point of J. A. Eggleston's field which the new road will cross. With this bridge built, the new road will be graded into the highway.

It will follow approximately the same route as the present county road from Mr. Eggleston's corner to the Johnson & Franklin farm where it will turn east into the old Innaha road. A new and higher grade will be built across the low ground through which Prairie creek runs and bridges will be constructed on pile foundations. This will be much cheaper than concrete and such structures last 25 years or more.

Funds for construction of this piece of road come from the post road money raised by sale of bonds in 1919. This also is a market road and will receive money in its turn from that source.

**Start On North Job**  
Both members of the firm of Joadyn & McAllister, who have the contract for surfacing the lower seven miles of the north highway, were in town during the week, making final preparations for the job. Wess Birchfield remains as their superintendent. All equipment and machinery is on hand and gravel will soon be tumbling from the crusher.

The first rock opening, near Sam Bonister's house, proved a disappointment, as the ledge did not seem large enough to furnish enough material. Another opening was made in the same neighborhood and it is believed sufficient rock is now in sight to cover the road.

**Work On Forest Highway**  
Steady progress is being made on the extension of the forest highway by the Security Construction company, contractors on the job. They began at the north end and have graded about three miles of road, the new line cutting the old road in several places. As the earth is very dry and the soil light, this makes a dreadfully dusty road and cars bump over hidden rocks and are well shaken up. A rail is needed to make this road tolerable for travel.

## NEW YOSEMITE HIGHWAY OPEN

YOSEMITE VALLEY, Cal., Aug. 7. (AP)—Motorists from many parts of the United States joined with state and national officials recently in celebration of the opening of a new highway into this mountain-land playground. The new route takes the "shudder" out of getting into the valley, shortens the trip through elimination of terrific grades, from nearly a day to three hours (from Merced), and will make possible keeping the Yosemite open the year around. The road was carved by convict labor through eighteen miles of solid granite that walls Merced River canyon.

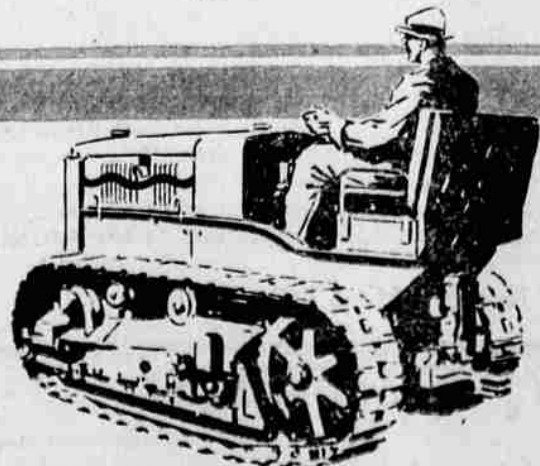
