"MA" FERGUSON PREPARING
DALLAS, Tex., Aug. 12. (AP)—The second Texas primary campaign for the democratic gubernatorial nomination, headed by Mrs. Ferguson today as governor Miriam A. Ferguson mobilized her followers on an anti Ku Klux Klan platform in her attempt to defeat Attorney General Dan Moody. The governor's platform is virtually the same as that on which she rode to victory a year ago.

Branding the July ballot, in which Moody led her by a wide margin, as a boiling Ku Klux Klan primary, Mrs. Ferguson has entered the run-off contest in direct reversal of plans under which she said she would withdraw from the race and resign from office this fall. Her action throws the state into a campaign of final election status as the democratic nomination is tantamount to election.

Leaders of the Moody faction have been invited to a mass meeting here Saturday to complete preparations for a state wide drive in which the attorney general declares he will send speakers to every school district to discuss "Fergusonism."

In a statement yesterday, Governor Ferguson announced she would remain in office until her term expired in January. Referring to her offer to withdraw if Moody led her in the July voting, she declared she was not bound to this because the attorney general failed to accept the proposition. Moody charged the statement was prepared by James E. Ferguson, the governor's husband.

**STOCK MARKET
RALLIES TODAY**

NEW YORK, Aug. 12. (AP)—The stock market rallied briskly today after an effectual attempt of bear traders to unsettle the list by renewed selling attacks on some of the "poetical" issues. Trading, however, was of a rather nervous character because of the uncertainty surrounding the General Motors dividend action and the New York federal reserve re-estimate rate, action on which will be taken after the close of the market.

General Motors opened 2 1/2 points higher at 26 1/2, advanced to 26 3/4 and then broke to 26 1/2 under heavy selling by bear traders, who apparently counted on touching off an enormous volume of "stop loss" orders around 26. Buying support was immediately forthcoming, however, and the stock quickly rallied above 26 1/2 and then on to above 26 3/4. U. S. Steel common and Dupont also made quick recovery after touching new low levels for the week.

IDENTIFIED
AS KILLER**

Brown was turned over to District Attorney Clarence Ward and Chief of Police Lester. In grand jury charges, of Santa Barbara, yesterday by Sheriff Walter A. Shay, of San Bernardino, who went to bring the prisoner from Needles, and who expressed a conviction that he was Max Tinsell's slayer.

He was first taken to Los Angeles, where an effort to definitely connect him with a hat found in the room in which Mrs. Tinsell was killed, failed. Brown told officers that the hat was his and offered to take them to the store in Los Angeles in which he bought it. The clerk at the store failed to recognize him, saying that he only recently resembled a man who bought a hat at the store about 15 months before.

After the visit to the store, the stranger suspect was taken to the roundhouse at San Fernando, where the district attorney declared that he recognized him as Mrs. Tinsell's assailant.

Although apparently wishing a trial of officers to every possible end, Brown has made numerous conflicting statements, some of which are point blank denials of previous admissions attributed to him.

At various times, according to officers, he has admitted attacks upon 12 women, naming San Francisco, Santa Barbara and Los Angeles as among the places in which the attacks occurred.

Investigators say that Brown's mind is unusually weak from the ravages of disease and the use of drugs to which he is addicted. The condition of his mind is such that he remembers in only a hazy way the details of his alleged attacks.

Officers have not told him that he faces a murder charge. He was said to have left his victims not knowing that they had been fatally strangled, and thinks he is involved only in statutory charges.

Questioned about the murder of Sylvia Gaines in Seattle and murder also in Phoenix, Ariz., last April, Brown said that he did not remember attacking a woman in the northern city, and that he did not remember ever having been in Phoenix, although he visited Yuma some time earlier this year. He also denied in his later statements any knowledge of the 28-year-old Phoenix girl's death.

He said that he had never been in that city. It has been definitely established that Brown is an escaped inmate of the state insane asylum at Patton, San Bernardino county. He was committed to that institution in 1915 as Paul Cameron.
