### "Best Bad Man," Adapted from Brand Novel, at Star

When you see Tom Mix in "The Best Bad Man," which opened at the Star theater, you're going to experience more genuine thrills than you ever believed could be crowded into one evening. Something decidedly new in Western photoplay presentation is offered in "Whispering Smith," at Sherry.
