CUBE BUTTER MARKET FIRM

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 19 (AP)—No changes are shown in the cube butter list for the day and the market is generally steady. Both make and current receipts have dropped off during the past 24 hours. Arrivals Friday amounted to only 3788 pounds with the local make reported at 6667 pounds and storage stocks were drawn on for approximately 6822 pounds.

First grade eggs are down two cents on the local exchange at 54 cents and mediums or pullets off a cent at 50 cents. Extras and current receipts held steady.

Recent rains are expected to cause considerable seasonal growth in yields in potatoes, especially crops planted during May and June, according to local jobbers. Locally the potato market remains a tame affair but prices are firmer and the demand better in the east. Better prices and a brisk call for strictly United States No. 1 stock this winter is being freely predicted by market dealers.

Continued weakness in the wheat market has resulted in further declines in four prices here. Family patterns are 20 cents lower while "backers" grades dropped 40 cents a barrel.

Oregon will produce an onion crop of approximately 285,000 bushels, according to the latest estimate in the bureau of crop estimates. This compares with 295,000 bushels last year. The average has been reduced from 1620 last year to 296 acres this year.

General Sag Features Wheat Trading Today

CHICAGO, Aug. 19 (AP)—Starting at 3 1/2 decline to a life advance, wheat underwent a moderate general sag. Corn and oats were easier, corn moving 3/4 to 5/8 off and subsequently receding a little more. Provisions scored gains.

Not closed irregular at 3 1/2 net decline to 3 1/2; corn 3/4 to 1 1/2 down; oats unchanged to 3/8 to 5/8 off and provisions varying from 5c setback to an equal advance.

Herbert Hoover Will Inspect Project Today

SPOKANE, Wash., Aug. 19 (AP)—Herbert Hoover, secretary of commerce and chief engineer, was shown the Columbia basin irrigation project today by a delegation of its supporters.

Arriving here this morning from Boise, Idaho, on a speaking and campaign tour, the secretary left shortly afterward aboard a special car for Albany Falls, on the Donald O'Reilly river, near Newport, Wash., to inspect the site of the proposed diversion dam for the irrigation project.

He will return to Spokane this afternoon and tonight will be guest of honor and speaker at a banquet.
