IN 1925, New York disposed of Scott to Washington and the Senators obligingly came through with another pennant.

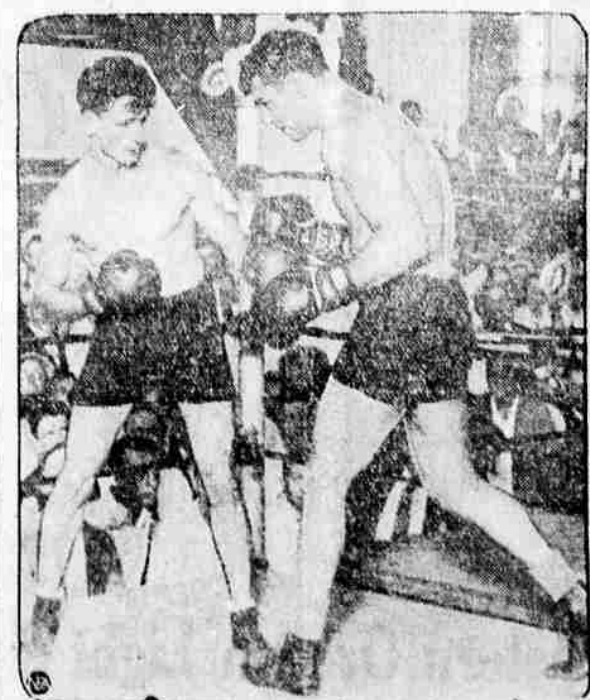
GETS CHICAGO OFFER

GEM 'FENCES' UNDER ARREST

NEW YORK, Aug. 21. (AP)—Two Harlem pawnbrokers, Joseph Roth and his son Robert were in jail here today charged with receiving stolen goods in connection with the theft of jewels valued at as much as \$500,000 from General and Mrs. Cornelius Vanderbilt at Newport, R. I.

While the pawnbrokers were being arraigned here for their alleged connection with the theft, detectives began checking over the seized gems worth \$15,000.

Five cases of jewels were stolen from the "breakers," the Newport mansion two weeks ago while the Vanderbilts were entertaining friends at dinner.

Some of the gems seized by detectives here when the Roths were arrested were a bracelet set with 55 diamonds, three diamond studded bracelets and several rings.
