## WHEAT PRICES ENTER SLUMP

CHICAGO, Aug. 24. (AP)—Wheat prices took an early downward course today, influenced by better weather conditions for the Canadian harvest. Besides crop reports from Canadian railroad sources tended to confirm present optimistic forecasts of a liberal yield. Opening unchanged to 3/4 off wheat underwent a moderate general setback. Corn and oats were easier, corn starting 3/4 to 5/8 decline and subsequently sagging a little more. Provisions showed strength.

Improved weather condition in the spring wheat harvest region both north and south of the Canadian line, led to lower prices today. Export buying of North American wheat today totaled only about 200,000 bushels.

Wheat closed weak 3/4 to 1 1/2 net lower; corn 3/4 to 1 3/8 down; oats 3/4 to 5/8 off and provisions varying from 17 cents decline to 5 cents advance.

### Henry Ford Goes into Hemp Farming Business

SOUTH CHALLESTON, Ohio, Aug. 24. (AP)—In addition to his various other enterprises, Henry Ford is going into the hemp farming business.

Two years ago he bought a 2,000-acre tract of land on the right of way of the Detroit, Toledo and London railroad near here. The land was divided into farms and let out to tenants. Today the tenants received notices to vacate by March 1, 1927, and it was explained the manufacturer intended converting the property into a hemp farm.
