ROUND-UP TICKETS ARE AVAILABLE IN LA GRANDE

The first time in the history of La Grande's pageant of the Pacific Round-Up tickets for the 1926 show are available here at home.

A full section for the four days of the show—one admirably located both as to view and as to freedom from the dust and the sun—has been reserved for La Grande patrons, and the tickets are being offered for sale beginning today at the Grand Drug store.

The largest attendance in the history of the show is predicted by Fred McKinnon, who arranged for the sale of these seats. Four complete sections have already been sold through the store, he has learned, and the advance sale of seats is about twice as large as in previous years.

Local patrons will have a better choice of seats if they purchase their tickets in La Grande than if they leave their orders to the mail. Mr. McKinnon, incidentally, will at the same time insure this territory the same accommodation in years to come.

Electric Light Bulb Price Reduction Made

FITTING, Aug. 25 (AP)—A 2 to 7 per cent reduction in the price of electric light bulbs has been announced by the West-Ingleside Electric Manufacturing company.

The cut, made possible by a 20-cent price cut in a new standard line of lamps and a per cent on all other styles, it will be effective September 1. Company officials said the reduction would save electric bills more of the nation approximately \$1,000,000 annually.

11 BODIES RECOVERED FROM MINE

(Continued from Page 1)

was trapped by the wall of the mine with the explosion. The blast split his iron helmet, and the wrecked mine did not catch fire.

Rescuers worked feverishly today in their efforts to recover the bodies of the 12 missing men. Some of these bodies had been sighted but it was impossible to get them because of cave-ins.

Coal Loader Escapes

At least one man, Michael Reardon, a coal loader, escaped unhurt following the explosion in the mine and as he mingled with crowd before the mine entrance, he told his story.

Reardon said he was working with several other miners in the third room from the entrance when without warning a deafening explosion occurred and that as they started for the mine mouth there was another deafening blast followed by a cloud of smoke and dirt.

The little group, battling for breath, stumbled toward the entrance, the loader said, and on the way saw several men lying on the floor, but could not tell whether they were dead or injured.

In the temporary morgue near the Claver mine today rested the body of 19-year-old Howard Thorsburn—his life crushed out in consequence of his efforts to obtain money with which to continue his study at Gettysburg college.

Howard's father met death two years ago under a freight train. Howard obtained a post as an electrician's helper in the Claver mine. This was to have been his last week at the mine.
