Men and Women Liquor Law Violators Fined

KLAMATH FALLS, Aug. 27. (AP)—Fines ranging from \$500 downwards and varying jail sentences, mostly of short duration, were meted out to those of the 25 men and women taken in Saturday's wholesale liquor raids who stood trial yesterday. Some have pleaded not guilty and been released from jail and some are in jail awaiting trial. Climaxing a day of thrills for dozens of the underworld, these establishments were raided in Clatsop, Klamath reservation metropolises, Thursday night, with four arrests made. Those taken in Clatsop face federal charges. Nearly all of those taken in raids here Thursday were comparatively newcomers.
