## CALIFORNIANS CHOOSE YOUNG

## Stewart's Washington Letter

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 3. (AP)—Practically complete returns early today indicated the nomination of C. C. Young, one of five Republicans who opposed Governor Friend W. Richardson in his race for renomination at last Tuesday's primary. With only 143 precincts in the state, 11,271 in the state, Lieutenant Governor Young was 32,292 votes ahead of the governor and more than 220,000 ahead of his nearest competitor.

The figures: Young 324,732; Richardson 312,491. Justus S. Wardell, of San Francisco, appeared to have won the democratic gubernatorial nomination. His vote in 8123 precincts was 23,237 as against 51,404 polled by his dry anti-Tammany opponent, Carl Alexander Johnson, of San Diego, whose candidacy was endorsed by William Gibbs McAdoo, contender for the democratic presidential nomination in 1924.

For state senator, Samuel Shortridge, a Coedige republican who ran for renomination on his record, had a lead of more than 96,000 votes over his nearest opponent, Robert M. Clarke. The vote in 7986 precincts was: Shortridge 328,589; Clarke 232,632. Clarke, who made opposition to the world court and the principal plank in his platform, was supported by Senator Hiram Johnson, who also campaigned for Young in the gubernatorial contest.

John B. Elliott, whom McAdoo endorsed for the democratic senatorial nomination, was swept ahead of J. Edgar Dockweller, the man he opposed in an alleged nationwide plot to swing the 1928 democratic presidential nomination to Governor Al Smith of New York. The vote in 7986 precincts was: Elliott 57,821; Dockweller 26,450.

Burton Pitts, former American Legion department commander, won the republican nomination for lieutenant governor by a tremendous margin. In the returns from 7372 precincts he was more than 103,000 votes ahead of Frank Merriam, speaker of the state assembly, his nearest rival. The vote stood: Pitts 362,841; Merriam 199,534.

## NEW MT. EMILY TOWER BUILT

Commanding a view of all Union county, and parts of Umatilla, Baker, Wallawa and Grant counties, the new lookout tower that rises from the highest point on the top of Mt. Emily ranks with the finest in Oregon, according to L. H. Russell, county fire warden. The lookout house is seven feet square, constructed of steel and glass, with no wood used except for the floor. It stands, at an elevation of 440 feet, on an 82-foot tower of steel. Four concrete posts, 18 inches square at the ground level and 32 inches square four feet below form the foundation. To each post is attached a lightning conductor consisting of 100 feet of steel cable that enters a four-foot hole filled with charcoal.

Cost \$1500. C. N. Teed, of Kuna, Ida., is the lookout man. A fire finder, a lightning conductor and a telephone compose his equipment. The Mt. Emily tower was built at a cost of \$1500, the state, the United States forest service and Union county fire association sharing equally in the expense. A crew sent in by the federal government did the work, which was completed about a month ago.

## WILLAMETTE IS NAVIGATED AS FAR AS SALEM

SALEM, Ore., Sept. 3.—Completing its first run between Portland and Salem since June 13, the river steamer Northwestern, docked at Salem at 3:30 o'clock Wednesday afternoon, discharged its cargo at the local dock, took on a few cargo and pulled out for its return trip down the river at 5 a. m. Thursday. The steamer had a difficult trip due largely to imperfect valve adjustments of the engines, which were completely overhauled during the summer and which as yet have not been placed in perfect working order.

Hauled 60 Tons Freight. The boat brought 60 tons of freight up the river, and carried 70 tons back down again. The start from Portland was made on Saturday. At two places along the route it was found necessary to "line over" a process known to river navigators, and involving a slow, powerful pull on a cable fastened at one point on the shore ahead, while the wheel at the stern is reversed in order to throw water under the boat. This process was restored to at a swift pace just above Woodland park, and again at a big whirl in sight of the railroad bridge at Salem. At this second place the Dayton Digger, a dredge hired by the United States government to clear the channel, obstructed the way and the line was used in getting around it.

On Regular Run. Officials of the Salem Navigation company, which operates the Northwestern, stated this morning that the boat will be kept on its run here from now on, barring a phenomenal fall of the river. At the time the trip was made the river was just six inches above the lowest point to which it fell all season.

## Farm Pointers

As a dressing for tree wounds bordeaux paint properly made up not only carries the necessary disinfectant properties but likewise will last at least four years under Oregon conditions, says the experienting around it.

Use of seed pits for potato production in Oregon call for areas about one-tenth the size of the main crop field, says the experienting station. This amount of seed land produces enough potatoes to seed both the commercial and the field plots the coming year.

Bean weevil, prevalent in some places in Oregon, cannot be controlled in the field, the experienting station has found. Since the weevils multiply rapidly in the stored beans, fumigation with carbon bisulfide or heat is recommended. This treatment is applied as soon

after the beans are harvested and dried as possible. The seed is then stored in weevil-proof bags or other receptacles.

Italian prunes picked too early in Oregon remain tough in texture and sour in taste, experiment station investigations show. Picked too late the prunes soon lose their

firmness and spiciness and become flat in taste.

In lime-sulfur compound the sulfur, chemically combined with calcium to form polysulfide, is the principal ingredient. For all practical purposes, reports the O. A. C. experiment station, its concentration is measured by the hydrometer test, which for commercial brands should be not less than 20 degrees Baume.
