### Rapid Fire Action Shown in Film At Sherrys

"It all happened so quickly." How familiar the phrase when an audience files from a motion picture theater after having viewed a rapid-fire picture. Events that have a bearing on scores of lives, counting one upon another in quick succession, almost confound the spectators.  
 Yet, when the picture is being "shot" each scene requires many minutes, sometimes hours, of conscientious work. An incident that is flashed upon the screen in thirty seconds may have required several days to photograph.  
 One of the most striking examples of this phase of motion picture making is seen in the Royal Picture, starring William Russell, "Before Midnight," at Sherrys today only.

The fiftieth anniversary of the massacre of Gen. George A. Custer and the men of his command, the famous Seventh United States of America Cavalry, by Chief Sitting Bull and his Sioux Indians, is to be commemorated in fitting manner by the Seventh Cavalry of today and the surviving relatives of the gallant troopers who went to their death in the battle of the Little Big Horn on June 25, 1876. In honor of this historic event Universal Pictures Corporation has made a spectacular Western picture, titled "The Fighting Frontier." 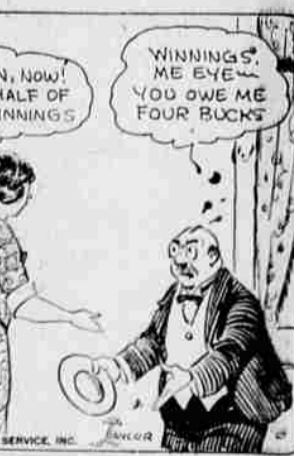
