The Sproule-Reitz company's 49c store will open here tomorrow morning. Lesley White, manager, has been in La Grande for several days preparing for the opening. Nothing in the store will sell for more than 49 cents, and a complete line of 5, 10 and 15 cent merchandise will be handled.

The store, which is one of an Oregon chain, is located in the Roesch building on Adams avenue.

To Minnie Crull and Henry Crull, her husband:
In the name of the State of Oregon, you are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed herein on or before the 25th day of October, 1926, said date being more than six weeks after the first publication of this summons and said period of six weeks being the time prescribed in the Order for Publication of Summons, and if you fail so to appear and answer plaintiff will apply to the court for the relief demanded in this complaint, to-wit:

That plaintiff have and recover of and from the defendants as follows:

That the following described property, to-wit:

The Southeast quarter of Section ten (10), the Southwest quarter of Section eleven (11), the East half of the Northeast quarter of Section fifteen (15), and the North half of the Northwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section fourteen (14), all in Township two (2), North of Range thirty-nine (39), East of the Willamette Meridian,

together with all of the logs and timber already logged off of the above described property to be declared and decreed to be security for the payment to the plaintiff of the sum of \$3,000.00 together with interest thereon at the rate of 6% per annum from the 20th day of April, 1922, less, however, the sum of \$200.00 paid on account of interest, and as security for the further payment to the plaintiff of the sum of \$500.00 attorney's fees and the plaintiff's costs and disbursements in this suit expended.

That that certain mortgage recorded in book 47, of mortgages, page 40 thereof, records of Union County, Oregon, on the above described property, together with the timber and logs cut from said property be foreclosed, and the same be sold according to law and the practice of this court, and plaintiff be permitted to purchase said property upon execution sale by the sheriff; that the sale of the real property shall carry with it the sale of all of the logs and timber cut, or otherwise.

That the proceeds of said sale be applied (1) to the payment of the expenses of suit and sale; (2) to the amount to be decreed to be due the plaintiff on said mortgage; (3) any balance to be paid to the clerk of this court to be disbursed by him as by law provided.

That the defendants and each of them be enjoined from removing or disposing of or attempting to remove or dispose of any logs or lumber from said land.

That the defendants, Minnie Crull and Henry Crull, her husband, F. M. Smith, a widower and F. C. Brosius, and each of them, be barred and foreclosed of and enjoined from asserting any right, title, lien, claim or interest in, to or upon said real property, or any part thereof, except only the statutory right of redemption.

And for such other, further and different relief as to this court may seem proper.
