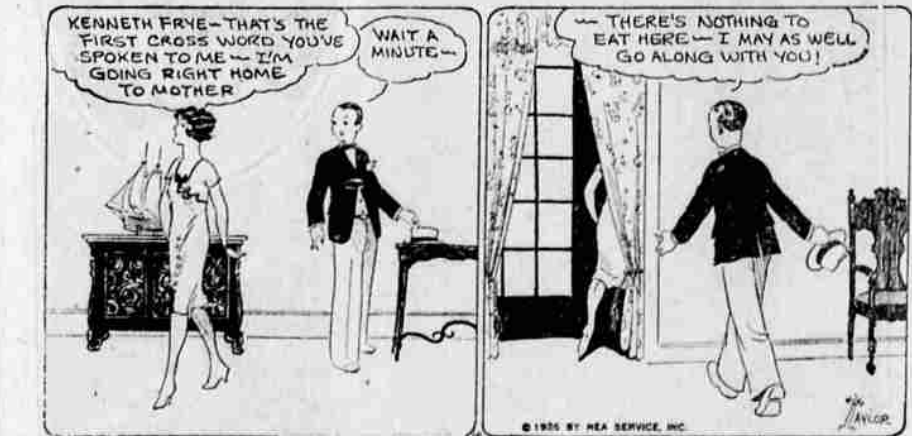
Marie Prevost At Her Best in "Seven Sinners"
