TO INVESTIGATE HAZING EPISODE

Mother of Injured Girl
Asserts High School
Principal at Affair

SALEM, Ore., Sept. 27 (AP)—A full and complete investigation by the county juvenile authorities into the alleged hazing of Stayton high school freshmen last Friday night, which resulted in the injury of three students when an automobile in which they were being taken out into the country crashed into a telephone pole, was promised this morning.

Dolores McKinnon, 14, whose chest was crushed and who suffered bruises and cuts on her legs, and Stanley Cieslak, 16, both of whose legs were fractured, were resting more comfortably in a local hospital this morning.

Mrs. McKinnon said this morning that she would demand a public retraction of the statement made by O. V. White, principal of the high school, that the accident happened during a joy ride following a high school party. The mother declares that the party wound up in a hazing episode, that Dolores was blindfolded before being placed in the car to be taken out into the country to be left to walk back, and that she has witnessed to prove that Mr. White was present and made no objection to the hazing.

Dr. Moore Will Go On Trial Nov. 15

PORT ANGELES, Wash., Sept. 27 (AP)—Judge W. O. Chapman, of Tacoma, sitting in Clallam county superior court here, fixed bail for Dr. Paul D. Moore, of Sequim, Wash., and Nashville, Tenn., at \$20,000 and set trial for November 15. Moore who pleaded not guilty, is accused of killing his wife with poison.
