

SALEM SCHOOL ENROLLMENT PASSES 4,000

SALEM, Ore., Sept. 25—For the first time in history, total enrollment in Salem public schools has passed the 4,000 mark during the

first week of school. Statistics made public at the office of the city superintendent of schools show that 4,168 pupils attended grades, junior and high school in this city during the week that marked the opening of school. The number is 350 higher than the corresponding number just a year ago.

General Hines To Command New Area

ninth corps area, San Francisco. He will be succeeded by Major General Charles P. Summerall, now commanding the second corps area, New York, while Major General James H. McRae, present commander of the ninth corps area, will take General Summerall's place in New York. General Hines will take a leave

of absence on relinquishing his duties as chief of staff and the date for his arrival in San Francisco has not yet been set.

J. J. SMITH GETS TWO BUCK DEER

La Grande Man Secures Season's Quota in Rock Creek Country

To get two deer—the season's limit—in less than two minutes this was the luck of Joe J. Smith, who has just returned to La Grande after a hunting trip in the Rock Creek vicinity with his kill. Mr. Smith went out with Clarence Talbot and Jack DeLaney Saturday night and was successful in bagging the limit by 7:10 o'clock the next morning. The other two hunters were not so successful.

The deer were traveling together and after Mr. Smith had fired one shot, killing the first one, he turned upon the second, which required two bullets before it fell. The largest buck, four pointer, weighs about 250 pounds. The other one, which has two points, weighs between 150 and 200 pounds. Mr. Smith plans to have the head of the smaller animal mounted.

Bill Nibarger, of La Grande, was also successful in bringing home a buck yesterday. His deer, which was killed near Spring creek, is a four-pointer and will weigh about 200 pounds. Elmer Ross also recently shot a buck.

Needy Get Venison Some of the needy of the city are also probably enjoying venison killed and brought to town Sunday by Game Warden John Walden and given to the Salvation Army.

The deer—a yearling buck—was found dying along the highway between here and Pendleton this morning by a Mr. Dickerson, who was coming to La Grande from

Milton with a carload of fruit. The animal was evidently running from something and was unable to stop when it came to the cliff over the highway. It fell on the hard surface head downward, knocking its brains out. Mr. Dickerson remained at the place until another man came to town to notify the game warden, who went to the scene immediately.

Airplane Rescues Stunt Performer In Fourth Attempt

EVANSVILLE, Ind., Sept. 25 (AP)—George "Dime Devil" Ashby, airplane stunt performer, is alive through heroic work of pilots of two airplanes at a benefit air circus for Florida storm relief Sunday. Ashby's act the last on the program, included trapeze work on a rope ladder suspended beneath a machine. With his body numbed by a cold wind, he attempted to climb the ladder, but lost strength. He slipped and was suspended at the end of the rope, a loop caught about his leg.

Floyd Stark, pilot signalled for aid. Lester Kirk, another flyer, went upward when the signal was received. Four times he jockeyed his plane beneath Ashby. The fourth time Kirk got his plane beneath Ashby. He stood in the cockpit and grasped the man's arms. Ashby's body fell upon the top wing of Kirk's plane. Kirk then managed to get a hold upon the prostrate form to keep it from the machine, which for several moments sped along virtually without a pilot's control.

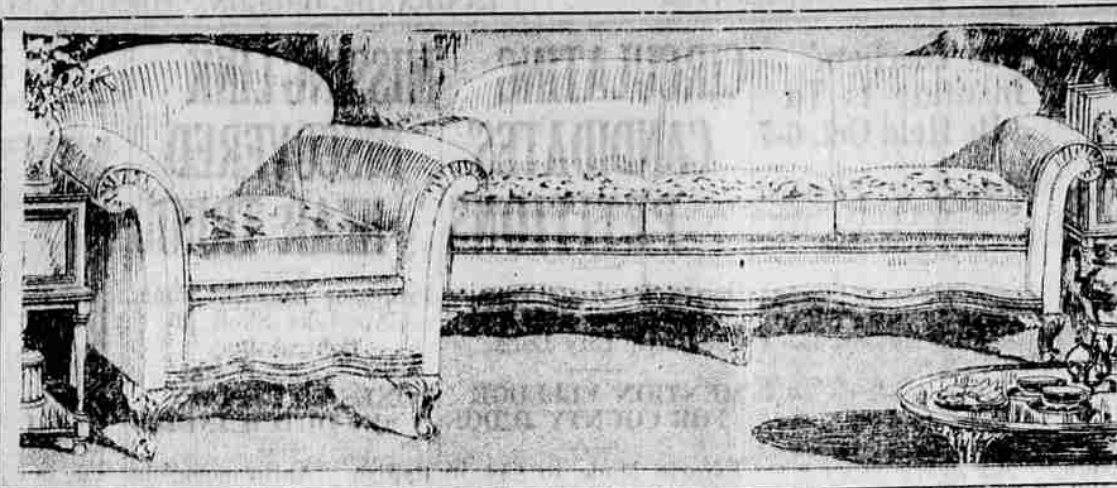

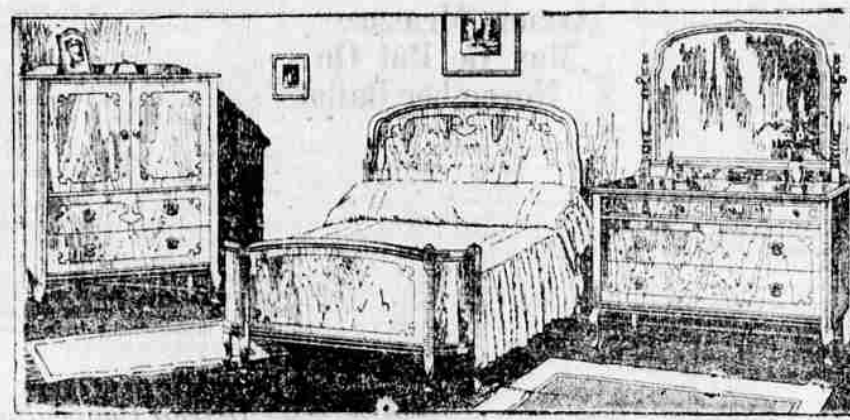
