The fight was a slambang affair from the opening gong. The Omaha boy staggered Roberts in the third with a terrific right to the head. Roberts came back in the next round and floored Schlaifer

or three times and had him in a helpless condition when the referee stopped the fight.

Bob Jubb, Des Moines, won a six-round decision over Billy Gardner, Portland welterweight, in the semi-windup.

CARD BACKSTOP IS RATED FIRST

Bob O'Farrell Given Edge Over Receivers on Yankee Team

NEW YORK, Sept. 29 (AP)—If Rogers Hornsby knows his Cards, and he thinks he does, he has an ace in first string catcher Bob O'Farrell. The former Cub is credited by his manager with being the most valuable player on the club and this flattering opinion is shared by many other wise baseball men.

Although Hank Severold carries vast and valuable experience with him behind the bat for the Yankees, and Pat Collins is a dangerous long distance hitter, the close observers give O'Farrell a decided edge over either of Huggins' receivers.

O'Farrell, barring injury, will catch every game for the National league entry. The work of backstopping for New York probably will be divided between Severold and Collins. Ernest Vick, ready to substitute for O'Farrell, if necessary, although holding a post-graduate degree as a football player, still is a major league apprentice.

O'Farrell and Collins have the same batting average, .292. If the statistical averages are to be believed. The same source credits each rival catcher with seven home runs. O'Farrell, however, has played 146 games while Collins has appeared in 191.

Severold, bringing his pennant luck to the Yankees from Washington as he took it to the Senators when traded by St. Louis, has batted in 61 games for an average of .260.

Vick has played in only 23 games batting .208.
