CHOICE APPLES RETAILING AT \$1

Potato Outlook in Oregon Improves—Estimate 6,000,000 More

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 29. (AP)—Choice apples are cheap. Jonathans and Grimes Golden selling at \$1.00 a box retail. The local hog market is weak at 13c a pound. All dealers are loaded down with country dressed hogs. Veal is also weaker at 14c a lb.

Eggs and butter are firm in price. Except that light hens are dragging, poultry prices are firm. Production of potatoes reported by the federal bureau of markets showed for September a yield of about 6,000,000 bushels over the estimate for August 31, but the total was still 45,000,000 bushels below the five year average and 25,000,000 bushels above last year's output.

Locally, the rains of this month have matured potatoes to a degree that will make up for the shortage which seemed certain a month ago. No. 1 stock of late digging has not yet appeared in the Portland market, although another crop is well sold out.

Portland dealers are paying \$24 to \$25 a ton for potatoes at shipping points. Only prime quality is desired.

Movie Sidelights

The Cinderella of the fashion world, the beauty of a movie goddess, today in the good faith of all filmdom.

For it's the movie world of Cinderella, says Edwin King, vice president and general manager of production of the Booking Office station, which makes stars of many screen actresses and superintends the expenditure of the greater part of the millions that go into the making of motion pictures yearly.

"The age old story of rags to riches provides the plot for probable seven out of every ten pictures," the producer says. "Authors and screenwriters are paid fortunes to tell the same old story in different form and any idea which will make the old tale appear different is pounced upon by producers. It isn't that producers and stars are incapable of making other types, but the world wants to be told again and again the story of the poor boy and girl who made good."

In making the film version of "What Price Glory" the technical staff of Fox films set off 25 tons of dynamite and T. N. T., resulting in a bombardment of 150,000 explosions during the battle scenes. Due to elaborate precautions there were no casualties.

Joseph M. Schenck, chairman of the board of directors of the United Artists Corporation, has increased his life insurance to \$4,250,000. Adolph Zukor, head of Paramount, and William Fox, president of Fox films, each has \$5,000,000 insurance.

There is a man in Austria, L. L. who has not been in a motion picture theatre in ten years but who, nevertheless, in that same length of time has watched more than seventy-three million feet of celluloid drama flicker across the screen. His name is Rudolph Koubek and he is chief projectionist of cinema operator at the Paramount studios. His business is to run off the picture film, for purposes of cutting, dubbing and preview inspections. He has spun off as high as 30,000 feet in a day but his average run is around 15,000.

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 29 (AP).—President Donnelly, of the Northern Pacific, in a statement here late yesterday said it was expected that the Interstate Commerce Commission would use its good offices in an effort to adjust the differences between the Northern Lines and the Southern Pacific in the Central Oregon railroad situation, or would permit the Northern Lines to construct an extension of the Oregon Trunk from Bend to Klamath Falls independent of the Southern Pacific.

Mr. Donnelly said that conference between the two groups would be resumed as soon as chairman De Forest, of the Southern Pacific, returns from Europe, possibly early in October.

U. P. Stock Goes Above 167 Mark In Wall Street

NEW YORK, Sept. 29 (AP).—Marking up of the call money rate to 6 per cent, the highest of the year, was followed today by a vigorous bullish demonstration in the stock market, causing a hurried retreat of the short interest which had sold stocks heavily recently as a result of the tightening of the credit situation.

Nearly a dozen issues were carried up to new high prices for the year or longer, before the end of the third hour. Union Pacific was bid up above 167 and "Nickel Plate" and New York Central climbed at least 2 points above yesterday's final quotations. Radio Corporation was taken in large blocks on its way to a new high price at 56 1/2. Commercial Solvents "B" quickly jumped 5 points to a new record high at 193.
