Wenatchee Man Claims Record For Apple Crop

WENATCHEE, Wash., Oct. 1.—E. H. Gahringer has claimed the record for apple production for the Grimes Golden variety in this district. From four and one-half acres on his ranch he obtained 6882 packed boxes, 1520 boxes to the acre. Besides this he sold as culls, made up as windfalls and bruised apples, 724 loose boxes, about 500 packed boxes. He estimates he lost 15 packed boxes in the field. Adding these to the total of 6882 boxes makes a grand total of 7400 packed boxes, or about 1844 to the acre.

Silversides Start Running at Bandon

BANDON, Oct. 1.—The run of silversides has started in the river and commercial fishermen have been doing a big business for several nights. It is one of the best runs in years.

More than five tons of fish were cleaned, iced and boxed for shipment at the Bandon Cold Storage one day last week alone, and they estimate that they only received one-half the entire catch, there being several other fish buyers on the ground. The price paid has been 6 cents per pound for silversides, and 6 1/2 cents per pound for chinook. The chinooks run in number about one-tenth of the silversides.

8 STATES VOTE ON PROHIBITION

Referendums on Ballots; W. C. T. U. Seek "100 Per Cent Dry Vote"

CHICAGO, Oct. 1. (AP)—Voters in eight states at the November election, will have an opportunity to pass upon prohibition. The states are California, Colorado, Illinois, Missouri, Montana, Nevada, New York and Wisconsin.

In New York, Illinois and Wisconsin the referendum is on the question of asking congress to amend the Volstead Act. In Wisconsin, the proposition says "for the beverage purposes of an alcoholic percentage of 2.75." In New York the legislature passed a bill to place the question of the referendum on the ballot. In Wisconsin the proposition was adopted by joint resolution of the legislature. In Illinois, the referendum was initiated by petition.

The question in California is whether to repeal the Wright act, the state enforcement law, adopted by the people at a referendum in 1922.

In Colorado, the question will be submitted as a proposal to amend a section of the state constitution "enabling the legislature to provide for manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors, such amendment to be operative so long as in conflict with the laws of the United States."

The Missouri vote will be on the question of repealing the state enforcement laws passed in 1923. The Montana proposition is in the form of a memorial to congress to submit the Eighteenth Amendment again to the states.

W. C. T. U. Active In these eight states, the W. C. T. U. with 600,000 members, has laid plans to concentrate a fight to get a "100 per cent dry vote."

In Illinois, George E. Brennan, Democratic candidate for U. S. senator, who has advocated modification of the Eighteenth Amendment in his campaign speeches, is being actively opposed by the drys.

In New York, the drys are backing F. W. Christian, independent and dry opponent for Senator Wadsworth.

NEW WOMEN'S DASH RECORD

DUESSELDOFF, Germany (AP)—A new record for the hundred meter women's dash was achieved by Fraulein Junkers of Cassel, who ran the distance in 12.3 seconds.
