ERECT BUSINESS BUILDING HERE

George Currey to Build Between Roesen and Melville Structures

George H. Currey completed plans for the erection of a one-story brick business building at 1423 and 1425 Adams avenue, located between the Roesen building and the nearly-completed Melville structure. This decision on Mr. Currey's part to build there is considered as evidence of the trend to further expand the downtown district in a southerly direction.

A building permit will be ap-

plied for shortly in the amount of \$5,000. Mr. Currey's preliminary estimate on the cost. E. F. Heasler has the construction contract and work is scheduled to begin immediately. The job will be finished by Dec. 1, weather permitting.

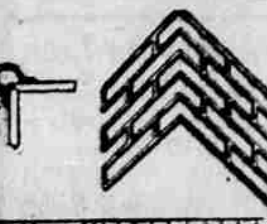
The plans for the building call for ground dimensions of 60 by 70 feet without basement. The whole will be divided into three store rooms, each 25 by 70 feet. Mr. Currey states that he already has two of these under lease.

The front of the building will be of pressed brick.

IMITATE BRICK



Stucco and plaster can be made to resemble brick, block or stone by using a grill with members arranged in a pattern like those of mortar joints. Hinges are provided for using the marker around corners and the pieces that produce the joint lines are that on the upper surface and triangular or rounded on the underside. In practice, the usual first coat of cement is placed on the bath and the marker imbedded in the material. The finish coat is then applied and the form removed, leaving grooves corresponding to those in masonry, declares Popular Mechanics.

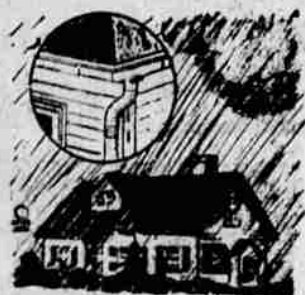
