If "Money Talks" at Sherrys isn't the funniest comedy ever made, it isn't the fault of the cast. For this picture has just about the funniest cast, no offense intended, that ever congregated in one picture.

Newest Carey Different; Harry Off Beaten Track

Harry Carey, interpreter of the eternal West, beloved cowboy, big-hearted, big-titted two-gun man of the great open spaces, gets considerably off the beaten track of Western pictures in his latest vehicle, at the Star Theatre, today and Wednesday, "Satan Town," one of the Carey series being distributed by Pathé.

Rather than being an all-conquering hero man hero of the plains, Harry is a kindly adventurer—one of those noble throngs who gathered at the beaches on Seattle's waterfront in the 1890's to the time of the magic call of gold. While he is endeavoring to get passage to Alaska, he saves the life of beautiful young girl. After Harry has purchased his ticket he finds that they are being sold in auctions on the dock at \$1,000 each, so Harry promptly sells his, after being promised a job as a stevedore, and finds time to seek out a lawyer and ask that the girl be placed in a boarding school.

Then Carey is off for Nome—and ten years later he comes back from the trail of fortune a millionaire. He learns that the man to whom he entrusted the education of the girl is a capitalist in view; that he has built Satan Town with its alley of nameless girls, and that he has educated his own daughter and allowed the girl whom Harry befriended to go out into the world alone.

In Satan Town, the city which bears the character of Bill Scott, some differentials between his real enemies and his friends and there he stages a battle for so-

ciety. In Salvation Sue, an "Army" lass, Carey sees the likeness of his little wife of years before.

Better it has gained in atmospheric situations and characterizations.

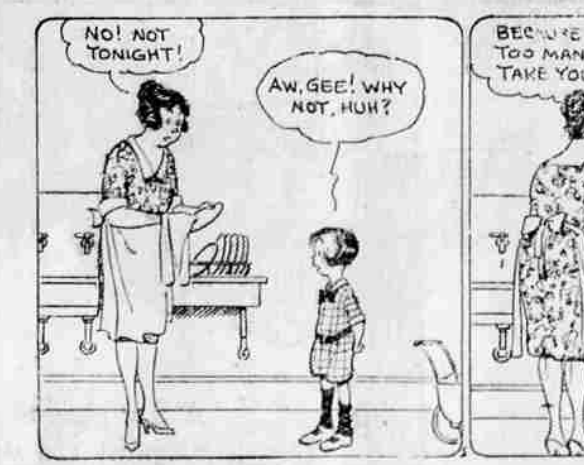
