Headquarters Near Viaduct The superintendent's headquarters will be located in the municipal warehouse, near the Second street viaduct. Also housed in this building are the headquarters of the sewer and water department, in charge of Horace Knapp. The street department was also formerly under Knapp's supervision.

Supt. Wright will have charge of the city flusher, the city caterpillar, and all maintenance work, from sidewalk to pavement, which will usually have a staff of from three to four employed. Grading of dirt streets and like projects are included in jobs assigned to this department.

An appropriation for a street department and a superintendent was made some time ago and everything was made ready for the change long before the final steps were taken.

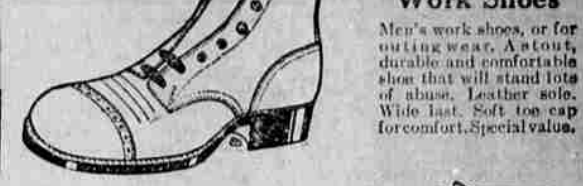

perate from starvation are eating dogs, cats and rats. Tree roots and leaves had already been eaten.

The military as well as the civilian also is starving after consuming all the livestock. Bodies litter the streets, unburied because coffins are unavailable, they being filled with sand and used as barricades.

The refugees report that 200 northern soldiers were killed during a recent sortie from the city gates.

The renegade vessels are to cross the Yangtze river again to bring to safety as many more refugees as possible. All peace negotiations between the opposing troops have been broken off entirely.
