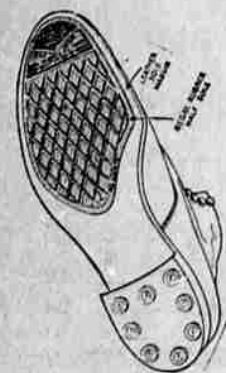

Bullitt Probe Is Recommended to Funds Committee

CHICAGO, Oct. 20 (AP)—An investigation of charges that large sums of money are being spent in Washington on behalf of the candidacy of A. Scott Bullitt, democratic senatorial candidate, was ordered today by the senate campaign funds committee.

ROSENWALD TESTIFIES
CHICAGO, Oct. 20 (AP)—An agreement among the friends of Hugh & Magill, independent republican candidate for the senate in Illinois, that his campaign fund should not exceed \$25,000 was testified today before the senate campaign committee by Julius Rosenwald, multi-millionaire merchant of Chicago.

Asked by Chairman Reed if there had been any suggestion among Magill's friends of raising a campaign fund of from \$500,000 to \$1,000,000, Rosenwald declared that this was "absolutely untrue." "We agreed that the total fund should not exceed \$25,000," he said adding that he had agreed to contribute up to \$5,000 of this amount and that Logan Hay, state senator of Springfield had agreed to give \$1,000.

Stocks Slide and Gain During Day

NEW YORK, Oct. 20 (AP)—Alternate periods of weakness and strength characterized today's stock market as opposing speculative forces struggled for control. Honors were about even during the greater part of the session, the uncovering of new weak spots among the specialties by bear traders being offset by the appearance of the stronger buying power for some of the high grade industrials and specialties.

Wheat Rallies But Fails to Keep Up

CHICAGO, Oct. 20 (AP)—Opening 1/2 to 1 1/4 up the Chicago wheat market reacted to about the same as yesterday's finish. Corn and oats swayed with wheat; corn starting at 1/4 to 1/2 advance, but subsequently losing about all the gain. Provisions were easy.

Wheat eased easy, 1/2 net lower to 1/2 advance; corn, 1/4 to 1/2 down; oats 1/4 to 1/2 1/2 off; and provisions unchanged to a net back of 45c.

BUTTER AND EGG STOCKS REDUCED

Material Reduction in Holdings Along Coast Is Shown

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 20 (AP)—A material reduction in storage holdings of butter and eggs on the Pacific coast is shown during the past week, according to department of agriculture figures just released.

Six of the principal markets on the coast showed a total reduction of 450,820 pounds of butter, while Portland holdings were reduced 29,257 pounds.

Storage holdings of butter are still liberal and it will require a steady withdrawal to move out the surplus by the time the next heavy season arrives.

Market Steadier
The local butter market is again displaying a fairly steady tone, especially on high score stock. Undergrade butter comes into competition with cooler stocks and hard to move at any fair profit.

No change is shown in butter quotations on the local dairy exchange for the day.

The local fresh egg market continues to display a good healthy tone. No further advances were made in exchange quotations today but recent gains held steady. Portland egg prices are now more in line with other markets than they have been for some time. Receipts are still light, however, and higher prices are likely.
