STOCK RECOVERY IMPRESSIVE ONE

Sharp Upturn in Prices, Large Volume Trading Feature Day

NEW YORK, Oct. 21 (By the Associated Press).—A sharp upturn in prices accompanied by an unusually large volume of trading took place in today's stock market. The recovery was the most impressive that has taken place since the start of the downward movement three weeks ago. Scores of issues were bid up 1 to 2 points with gains in a few shares running from 5 to near 9 points. United States Steel common and General Motors, which bore the brunt of the recent selling pressure, also were prominent on the rebound. The sharpest gains were recorded by the high-priced specialties such as Case Threshing Machine, Dupont and U. S. Cast Iron Pipe, all of which advanced 5 or more points. In the first hour of trading, United States Steel was another outstanding individual feature, rising more than 5 points to a new high record for the year on buying influenced by the announcement of recent railroad contracts. Approximate sales were 2,000,000 shares.

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Oct. 21 (AP)—In response to a request from District Attorney Asa Keyes of Los Angeles, Thomas T. Towne, stationary engineer and disabled war veteran, is prepared to go before district attorney E. A. Rogers here today to make a sworn statement of his asserted knowledge of the disappearance of Alvin Karpis, McPherson, Los Angeles evangelist. Yesterday Mr. Towne stated to a Tribune reporter that he saw Mrs. McPherson changing from a bathing suit to a street costume, in a sedan at Venice, Cal., on the day of the evangelist's "kidnapping."

Five Jacksonville Stores Are Robbed

MEDFORD, Ore., Oct. 21 (AP)—Five Jacksonville stores were entered by thieves early last night, and sums ranging from \$50 to \$200 were taken from tills and safes. A fire in the store of John Pappas, discovered about ten o'clock, led to the discovery of the robbery. Pappas thought burglars had set fire to his establishment and this led to an investigation of all the stores. This morning it was established that the fire started from a stove.

WOMAN'S SKULL FRACTURED

EUGENE, Ore., Oct. 21 (AP)—Mrs. Wade Davis, of Roseburg, is at the Eugene hospital here suffering from a fractured skull, as a result of a fall down a stairway leading from the basement to the apartment where she is staying. She struck her head on the cement floor in the fall.

INJURIES FATAL

EUGENE, Ore., Oct. 21 (AP)—Injuries sustained Tuesday afternoon when he was hit in the head by a piece of timber flying from a mill saw proved fatal yesterday for M. A. Davidson. He died at the Pacific Christian hospital where he was taken following the accident.

Ralph Greenhaw, 26, employee of the J. P. McCoy Lumber company of Goldsboro was severely cut on the left hip yesterday when he accidentally backed into a mill saw while carrying a piece of timber.

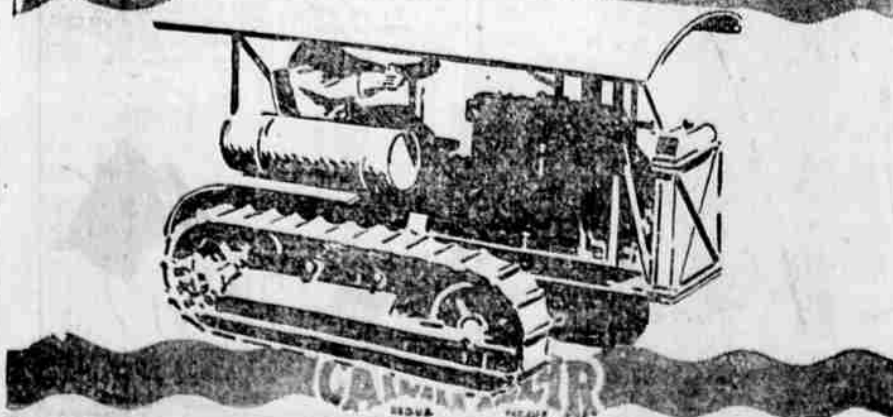
