Picturesque Isle of Pines
Devastated by Car-
ibbean Storm

**TOTAL CASUALTIES
STILL UNDER 1,000**

**Physicians, Food and
Medicine Are Being
Rushed to Aid of the
Thousands Injured.**

HAVANA, Oct. 23 (AP)—The picturesque little Isle of Pines paid a heavy toll in deaths, injured and material damage when the Caribbean hurricane passed over it Wednesday.

Survivors here say that 38 persons were killed. Among them 17 Americans. It is said that more than 200 persons were injured and that property and other losses would amount to \$50,000,000. The steamer Cristóbal Colon brought to Guatabano Cuba 52 injured persons.

Send Aid to Isles

Many wealthy white Americans have homes in the isle which is of an area of about 300 square miles 50 miles from Cuba. Citrus fruit crops such as the isle sends to the United States in great quantities.
