## Church of Christ Will Observe Its Annual Guest Day

### Missionary Workers to Present Evening Program—Pendleton Woman to Speak

Annual guest day program of the Missionary society of the Central Church of Christ Sunday evening, preceded in the afternoon by a rally and conference, is among the attractions announced for La Grande churchgoers tomorrow.

Mrs. Anna Keithley, of Pendleton, district secretary of missions, will deliver the main address at the evening service, the program for which is in charge of Mrs. L. R. Purdy. Mrs. H. J. Kitchen is president of the society.

At 2:30 p. m. the members of the society will discuss the needs of missionary work from a local aspect.
