Union Wins From Wallowa Eleven By a Touchdown

UNION, Ore., Oct. 25 (Special).—The Union high school football team defeated Wallowa Saturday 7 to 0.

The game was mostly a succession of punts, passes and end runs, with a few line plunges. Each

team tried pass after pass, and no sooner would the ball get into dangerous territory than it would get out either by a pass or punt. Most of the passes were incomplete and two of Wallowa's trials were caught by Union. The first half was scoreless, although both teams came near crossing the line. In the third Union bucked the line and J. Cox went over for our only touchdown. The kick brought the score up to 7, the only scoring of the game. Wallowa put up a mighty good scrap and both teams played with no penalties for roughness in any form. Union was penalized once for incomplete passes and there were two or three for offside. Jamison, of Enterprise, refereed.

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 25.—The University of Southern California went into a tie with Oregon Agricultural college and Stanford for the leadership of the Pacific coast football conference by defeating California, 27 to 0, in the most important struggle on the coast Saturday. The game was not a surprise, as the Trojan squad all season has been considered by grid followers as one of the strongest in the circuit.

Stanford also ran true to form in winning from Oregon in the annual homecoming of the Webfoots at Eugene, 29 to 12. The odds were 14 points in favor of Stanford before the game. It was the first conference game for the Redshirts this year and placed them in a nominal tie with the actual leaders.

Southern California and Stanford will meet next week in one of the decisive games of the season. Owing to the profane moaning of "Pop" Warner, Stanford coach, Southern California will go into the fray a decided favorite. Provided the Trojans can win, the crucial game of the year will be played in the Multnomah civic stadium between Southern California and the Oregon Aggies.

Washington State gave the dope pall its only boost Saturday by uprooting Washington, 9 to 6. The Cougars, however, were considered close contenders and though Washington was slated to win, the upset did not cause much more than a ripple of excitement among football fans.

Idaho defeated the College of Idaho 30 to 0, and Montana smothered Montana State, 27 to 0, in other games Saturday. Neither affected the conference standings. The Oregon Aggies remained inactive.

Play by Play Story of Saturday's Baker-La Grande Football Game

First Quarter.
Before a crowd of 1,000 persons or more, Baker kicked off to La Grande's 10-yard line. Quarterback Baker returning 5 yards after muffing the kick. An attempt to forward pass failed and Snyder gained 3 yards off tackle. Price tipped center for first down and Sherwood zipped off tackle for 4-13 yards in three plays. A second pass attempt failed, one yard was gained on a line plunge and Price punted to Hines, who was downed in his tracks on Baker's 35-yard line.

Hines skirled left end for 13 yards and then right end for 6 yards. Hines failed to gain and then rounded left end for 4. Duff going around the other end for 7 yards and first down on La Grande's 25-yard line. Duff was thrown for a 6-yard loss. Hines' perfect 25-yard forward pass was muffed. A crisis, Thomas to Hines, sent the colored boy on a 31-yard run for the first touchdown. Duff kicked goal.

Baker kicked to Baker who returned 32 yards almost getting away for a touchdown. Price ripped off a pretty broken field run for a 22-yard gain, placing the ball on Baker's 47-yard line. Price passed to Baker for 5 yards. Baker plunged 3. Sherwood gained 6 yards off tackle and Baker gained 5 yards on two plunges. Price speared a pass for 3 yards, but La Grande was offside, losing 5 yards penalty. Hines blocked an attempted forward pass, Price to Newlin, Baker taking the ball. Duff ripped off 13 yards around right end and Hines skirled left end for 13 yards, placing the ball on La Grande's 40-yard line. Thomas waded through center for 18 yards. Duff went 5 off left tackle, and Hines repeated with 2. Duff made first down putting the ball on La Grande's 9-yard line. Duff, in two plunges, advanced the ball to the Tigers' 3-yard line. Quarter ends. Score: Baker 7, La Grande 0.

Second Quarter.
Duff carried the ball over but his kick for goal was blocked. After the kickoff La Grande put the ball in place on the 25-yard line when Price hit the line for 10 yards and first down. Lyman carried the ball 5 yards to midfield. Price gained 3 off tackle and a fumble was recovered by the Bulldogs.

Hines hit left tackle for 4 yards and Duff was thrown for a 4-yard loss, attempting to skirt right end. Hines went around the left wing for 5 yards. A pass over Duff's head was recovered by La Grande on Baker's 13-yard line. A triple crisis cross, meant as a scoring play, was fumbled on the last exchange for a 6-yard loss. Price gained 5 around right end, a plunge failed, Baker failed to complete a forward pass and punted 20 yards to La Grande. Baker went through center for 2 yards and 1 yard to the 13-yard line. A forward pass attempt failed. Price tipped the ball, Lyman attempted to skewer the ball going out of bounds on Baker's 1-yard line. Duff punted 30 yards to Baker, who tumbled in midfield, but recovered the ball for no gain. Price was held for no gain, 2 yards were lost on a fumble. Lyman plunged 3 through the line and price punted 30 yards out of bounds. Baker tumbled the ball on her 25-yard line. Hines advanced 8 yards off left tackle and repeated with 5 more. Duff went around left end for 2 yards and Hines the other way for 1. Duff was held to no gain when overwhelmed by La Grande linemen. Duff punted 40 yards to Baker, who again fumbled but recovered on his 18-yard line. Baker scored 3 yards through center. Lyman raced the ball around left end for 2 and Price lost 1 yard off tackle. Lyman barely made first down on the next play. A forward pass was incomplete. Snyder ripped off 12 yards, fumbled, and recovered the ball. Baker was penalized 15 yards. The Bulldogs intercepted a pass, Hines was tackled for a 7-yard loss and Duff punted to Baker, who fumbled for the third time, but recovered the ball as the half ended. Score: Baker 13, La Grande 0.

Third Quarter.
Before the third period started Baker and La Grande rosters were lined up on the gridiron, each attempting to drown out the other with cheers for the teams.

La Grande kicked to Duff, who fumbled but recovered and returned the ball to the 13-yard line. Duff punted to Baker who was downed in his tracks on La Grande's 49-yard line.

Price gained 6 around right end. After a second attempt failed, Snyder made 6 for first down. A pass, Price to Zundel, netted 5 yards and Price speared around end for 8 more. Snyder tore through the line for 3 yards, placing the ball on Baker's 29-yard line. Lyman whirled around left end for 14 yards, forcing 3 and Lyman slithered through the Bulldogs for 14 more. With the ball on the 5-yard line Baker held the Tigers to no gain on the next play, then giving way to Lyman who plunged for 3 yards. Snyder carried the ball over on the next play. Baker kicking goal.

La Grande kicked to Baker's 1-yard line. Hines letting the ball roll thinking it would go over the goal line. An attempt to forward pass from behind the line failed and Adrian went back to punt. He fumbled the ball and Zundel fell on it for a touchdown. Baker converted, putting La Grande into the lead by one point.

La Grande kicked to Hines who returned 25 yards to Baker's 30-yard line. Thomas was hurt but stayed in. Duff gained 1 yard around end and Hines was held to the scrimmage line on an attempted end run. Baker lost 1 yard on an attempted crisis cross. Duff's punt was blocked, but passed the line of scrimmage. Baker fell on the ball but it was given to La Grande. Coach Glendeman protested and Referee G. L. Dutton read the rules to him.

Lyman tore open "Kendall" for 8 yards. Price failed to gain but Baker was offside, losing 5 yards and giving the Tigers first down on Baker's 38-yard line. Snyder

plunged 5 and then 2 through the line. Price gained three. Snyder fumbled and lost 1 yard. Price, from a punt formation, ran around end for 2 yards. Price was hurt but stayed in. Lyman advanced the ball to Baker's 20-yard line with a 5-yard gain and Snyder added 4 more with a line play. Price lost 3 yards on an attempted end run and Lyman placed the ball in position to score but skirting left end for 15 yards. Baker, from the 1-yard line, carried the ball over on a center sneak and then kicked goal.

La Grande kicked to Hines who returned to Baker's 45-yard line. Hines attempt to pass failed. La Grande backs smothering Baker's would-be receivers. Duff made 10 yards off right tackle and Hines raced around left end for an 18-yard gain, placing the ball on La Grande's 28-yard line. Score: Baker 13, La Grande 21.

Fourth Quarter.
Duff gained 7 yards around right end and Hines made 3 through the line. Hines was tackled for a 4-yard loss by Zundel. Hines gained 2 yards and Duff 1. Baker prepared to place kick directly in front of the goal for the 30-yard line. The pass from center was fumbled and a Baker back was tackled for a 10-yard loss. Price, Lyman and Snyder gained 5 yards on three plays and Price punted 40 yards out of bounds to Baker's 25-yard line. Hines weaved around right end for 14 yards and then 2 and 3 on a second and third play. Adrian fumbled for a 5-yard loss. Duff carried the ball 30 yards to the ball to La Grande's 30-yard line. Snyder and Lyman made 2 yards each and Price gained 4, then punting to Hines who was downed in his tracks. La Grande was penalized 5 yards and Baker took the ball on her 43-yard line. Hines skirled right end for 13 yards. Hines started a pass to his right end but Sevelin intercepted it. Price gained 7 yards around right end but the ball was called back and La Grande penalized 15 yards for holding. Lyman lost 2 yards and Lyman punted 30 yards out of bounds to Baker's 44-yard line. Duff gained 4 off tackle and then 4 through center. Hines made first down on a 4-yard off tackle plunge. A pass sent from Hines' educated hands, failed. Duff advanced the ball 3 yards and Hines gained 3 yards on a crisis cross. Duff made 2 yards for first down, placing the ball on La Grande's 39-yard line. Hines was tackled for a 13-yard loss. Duff gained 10 yards. There was 15 seconds left to play. Duff went back on a punt formation and, in attempting to find a man to forward pass to, was tackled for a 5-yard loss just before the timer's gun ended the game.

Final score: Baker 13, La Grande 21.
