Three Senators Report Expense Of Campaigns

WASHINGTON, Oct. 25 (AP)—George E. Brennan, democratic senatorial candidate in Illinois reported to the secretary of the senate Monday that he had spent \$40,894.97 in his general election campaign.

Senator Gooding, republican, Idaho, reported expenditures of \$2,248.19 and a contribution of \$2,500 from the republican national senatorial committee.

Senator Stanfield, of Oregon, running as an independent, reported contribution of \$5,000 and expenditures of \$5,997. The contributions included \$1,500 from Walter Hayes, \$2,000 from W. L. Thompson, \$1,000 from O. H. Fithfield and \$500 from George Wingfield.
