## HERRIN LIQUOR GANGS WARRING

HERRIN, Ill., Oct. 27 (AP)—Two warring factions in "bloody Williamson" county rested on their arms today in a tense atmosphere created by the slaying of two men in the latest renewal of hostilities in the county.

After the bodies of William McQuay and Ward Jones were found early yesterday gangs headed by Charles Birger and the Shelton brothers were reported heavily armed and ready to fight to settle bootleg business quarrels. McQuay and Jones were members of the Birger faction. McQuay's body was found on a lonely road riddled with machine gun bullets, while that of Jones was discovered in a creek. The latter had been shot four times.

Birger was reported last night moving his wife and women relatives from his home in Harrisburg. "We are going to get even and we are going to work fast," he told newspaper men. The Birger gang is reported to have an armored truck and a number of machine guns. Little is known of the strength of the Shelton group. The two factions formerly were united in opposition to the Ku Klux Klan but were said to have split over liquor operations.

Sheriff F. George Galligan said he had not heard of possession of machine guns by Birger, but knew of the armored car. He said he heard the car was kept "for protection."
