Cottage Grove's Lumber Industry Expands Rapidly

COTTAGE GROVE, (Special)—The growth of the lumber industry in Cottage Grove and vicinity has been an undemonstrative one. Few realize that the combined cutting capacity of Cottage Grove mills and those tributary to this city is greater than that of the huge Long-Bell operations at Longview.

Oregon has 20 per cent of all standing timber in the United States and of the amount one-sixth is tributary to Cottage Grove and must be marketed through this city. Cottage Grove one-fifth of all the timber in the United States and the greatest body of timber tributary to any city in the world.

Thirty-three mills are located in the territory between Drain and Creswell, which territory because of the configuration of the valley is tributary to Cottage Grove and the output of these mills is marketed through here. The mills and the mill camps of Cottage Grove employ 1000 men with a monthly payroll of over \$125,000. Eighty per cent of the 23 mills are in operation all the year round. The combined daily cut of these mills is 900,000 feet and this amount will be increased to within a million feet per day when the new Chambers and Son mill starts operations.
