LA GRANDE, Ore., Nov. 3.—Malheur county has set a record for game violations, or perhaps it might be said for convictions of game law violators during the past two weeks. With the addition of seven offenders convicted last week the total for two weeks stood at 19, Tuesday evening.

The outstanding case was that of Frank Collins and Frank Lew of Baker, who while hunting on the highway near John Wood's ranch, peppered the auto in which Mr. and Mrs. Ivan Wells were driving to Ontario. Mrs. Wells caught the number of the car and reported the case to Game Warden McClees when she reached this city. By spending several dollars in telegrams, the ownership of the car in which the Baker men were riding was established, and the men brought here for trial before Judge M. E. Bain who fined them \$25 and costs.

L. Stam and L. J. Highley drew \$25 and costs in Judge J. D. Hoger's court for hunting without a license. H. E. Rust and James Hoffman of Nyssa, were fined \$25 and costs each, and 50 muskrat skins were confiscated for trapping before the season opens.
