A few years ago Notre Dame had a backfield comprising Stuhldreher, Layden, Crowley and Miller. No doubt you have heard those names before.

It was a speedy combination that raced around the ends and through the line of the opposition at will.

"The Four Horsemen" was the nickname given to the Notre Dame backfield because of its great speed. It stuck to them to the end of their careers.

The Illinois backfield of this year has plenty of class. While it may lack the speed of the "Four Horsemen," it is a combination mighty hard to stop.

"The Four Mules" is the name Coach Hob Zuppke of Illinois gave to his backfield because of their stubborn qualities in refusing to be stopped.

The very latest, however, is the "Four Magicians," as applied to the University of Pennsylvania backs.

Now The Magicians The Penn team in its games to date has shown a baffling offense. The backfield resorts to a hidden ball attack that so far has completely mystified its opponents.

The Red and Blue backfield handles the ball much after the manner of a magician; first you see it, and then you don't.

It's tougher to decide who is carrying the ball for Penn than trying to beat the shell game by guessing where the little pea is.

It is said Coach Lou Young has had able assistance from the renowned Thurston in building up his offense. This Young will neither deny or affirm.

How Penn pulls the "hocus-pocus" stuff is a mystery.

CHICAGO, Nov. 5 (AP)—The western conference is taking up arms against the shift in football. "I intend to do everything in my power to eliminate the shift play," said Hob Zuppke, Illinois coach, in discussing the likelihood of such action at the rules committee meeting this winter in New York.

The offensive eleven has too much advantage, he argued, in hurling its attack against the defensive team with the aid of momentum acquired by rhythmic shifting, which is within or without the law by the margin of a second's fraction.

Starg at Chicago "wouldn't like to see that happen" but confessed that "there doesn't seem to be any other change in the present rule except to abolish the shift entirely."

Suggestion of general support of the view by eastern coaches comes from Tom Thorp, eastern official, who agrees with Zuppke that officials find it virtually impossible accurately to enforce the law and believes 90 per cent of the coaches on the seaboard favor abolition of the shift.

NORTHWEST IN GRID SPOTLIGHT
