

HOT SESSION OF CONGRESS IS DUE

Sequel to Jim Reed's Investigations Will Furnish Color

WASHINGTON—Washington is looking forward to a red hot session of congress this coming winter, as a sequel to Senator Jim Reed's activities as a primary election investigator.

Probably there will be no definite action until the 70th congress meets, but there will be plenty of talk in what's left of the 69th.

It will be talk, too, in which big names will figure.

The men to whom the names belong are not all involved personally in the scandals Senator Reed has been digging into, but at least they've been referred to in his inquiry which will be an excuse for mentioning them again in debate at the capitol.

Senator Watson, Senator Moses, Senator Mayfield, Imperial Wizard Evans of the Ku Klux Klan, postmaster General Will Hays, ex-Governor Goodrich, of Indiana, Everett Sanders, Congressman Vane, Frank L. Smith of Illinois.

All these are characters of one sort or another, in the story Senator Reed has been developing.

Senator Watson, to be sure, says the chapter about him is "absolutely false." Sanders, secretary to the president, appears in the narrative only long enough to declare that rumors of a political deal between Watson and Mayfield were "ridiculous."

Nevertheless, all these names are woven into the story's plot and add interest as big names do.

ARE YOU RULED BY YOUR LUNGS OR YOUR SKIN?

The human body is actually a manufacturing plant whose power comes from the food and water we eat and drink and which is transformed into the kinds of energy that characterize the living body.

Without oxygen the human manufacturing plant could not exist. Oxygen of the air is the great activator of the combustion carried on within. Every four or five seconds, whether awake or asleep, air is breathed into the lungs. The oxygen is set free from the other gases composing the air, and is taken up by the red corpuscles of the blood and carried by it to every part of the body.

These red corpuscles, loaded down with oxygen, deliver it actively for the combustion processes taking place everywhere in the tissue cells.

Practically, it is very difficult to insure this continuous supply of oxygen-containing air, even though we live in an ocean of such air, much as a fish lives in an ocean of water. The difficulty is due to the habit of retiring into "house caves" where the circulation of air is not good and where air easily becomes stagnant and vitiated.

The skin is the great impelling agent which drives us into these "house caves." One of the important duties of the skin is to help maintain an equable temperature of the body. This is accomplished through certain activities of its own and also through its nerves, sending and receiving messages to and from all the other organs of the body.

But the skin, like any other organ, may not function properly. Then its special activities may become impaired and it may not send or receive its nerve messages correctly.

The most common derangement is in connection with temperature changes. It loses its adaptability to variations in temperature changes. Instead of reacting vigorously and in proper balance, the skin shrinks and fails to respond properly to messages, and urges the body into "house caves" to escape temperature changes, both hot and cold.

As a result the body forms certain "house cave" habits which not only depreciate the general health, but which are extremely difficult to change. Our bodies become the battleground of a struggle between the whole body, continually calling for oxygen-containing air, and the skin, demanding a continuance of the in-

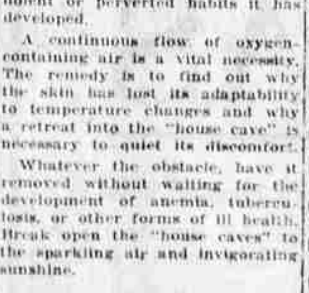
doient or perverted habits it has developed.

PRUNE MEN PLAN MARKETING UNITS

Further Organization by Growers of Two States Now Arranged

PALLAS, Ore., Nov. 5 (AP)—Further organization of prune men of Oregon and Washington for cooperative marketing was taken up at a state-wide meeting Friday at the Polk county court house. More than 200 growers were present.

Sentiment favorable to further organization work in the various prune growing districts was expressed and immediate steps will be taken to effect such organizations.

Independent Units.
The policy and form of these organizations will be left to the organizations themselves. They will be independent of the present units included in the Northwest Prune exchange and will have to effect some other marketing outlet but will have the support of the exchange locals which favor further organization of growers.

The need, as outlined by R. H. Kipp, Portland chamber of commerce marketing department; C. J. Hard, of O. A. C. George Neuman, of Portland, and Roseburg, and others, is an organization that can effect a minimum price guarantee to the grower and obviate price cutting. The matter of marketing, packing and other details were considered something to be worked out later.

Immediate organization of cooperative locals will be begun with the bankers association and business men of each county called into conference with growers. Representatives from communities who were present were asked to begin interesting their district in such meetings.

The only point of contention raised at the meeting was the question of independent packers. A pronounced element among the growers advocated retention of the

packers in any marketing scheme developed, while an equally emphatic group advocated complete elimination of private packers.
