U. S. Bureau Will War on Porcupines

MEDFORD, Ore., Nov. 11 (AP)—The U. S. biological bureau, I. C. Gabrielson, of Portland, in charge, has started a war on porcupines in the Butte Falls district, where they are plentiful and doing considerable damage to green timber and young trees.

It is nothing for a lively porcupine to gnaw 25 trees in a day. Very little is known, says Gabrielson, about the life and works of porcupines and an extensive study on this point is now being conducted in California, Oregon and Washington.

The porcupine is fond of green bark and a way is sought to eradicate him with no danger to protected animals. Poison is being distributed.

REINHARDT'S PROMPTER

To Build Branch

MANHATTAN, N. Y., Nov. 11 (AP)—This city has been chosen as the location for a branch of the Eugene Bible university, of Eugene, Ore. A deed was closed Tuesday whereby the university secured title to a property in the residence district near the Kansas State Agricultural college. Corinne in Comedy Role in "Syncopating Sue"

Corinne Griffith, after several romantic productions, has gotten hold of another light comedy picture of the sort "Classified" made at the Arcade. Friday, in "Syncopating Sue," which New York audiences are greeting as her most finished performance on the screen.

Cast as a piano player in a music store where she "plugs" songs to attract the attention of well known vaudeville artists, Corinne gives a wistful yet comic portrayal of a stage struck young flapper whose greatest desire is to see her name spelled out in the electric lights of Broadway.

Dancing and singing, in and out of snappy situations, mimicking, enacting, cutting up antics like the flapper she plays, Corinne handles this part with even more finesse than she showed in "Classified," which clinched her claim to highest histrionic honors.

Tom Moore plays the happy-go-lucky trap drummer in a Broadway cabaret, who is in love with the winsome "would-be" Marjorie Ransome, well known stage star; Rockliffe Fellowes, Lee Moran, Joyce Compton and Sunshine Hart complete the cast.

"Blue Eagle" Is Fast and Furious

Two of the screen's most popular players will be seen together again when George O'Brien and Janet Gaynor, Fox Films headliners, open a two-day engagement in "The Blue Eagle," at the Star theater Friday.

O'Brien is cast as George D'Arcy, a fighting warman, while Janet is sweet and enticing as Rose Cooper, sweetheart of the ward.

In "The Blue Eagle," a John Ford production based upon Gerald Beaumont's dramatic story of land and sea, "The Lord's Refuge," both George and Janet are called upon to give the best that is in them.

Critics who have previewed this release claim that these young favorites contribute the finest characterizations of their careers.

It is a story of two gang leaders and a girl, and the action, switching rapidly from the wards of New York to the decks of Uncle Sam's battleship during the World War, is fast and furious at certain stages of the development.

Father Joe, as portrayed by Robert Edeson, a veteran character actor, is one of those kindly disposed parish arbiters who always shoulders the other fellow's burdens and carries his own uncomplainingly.

He settles the feud in the end and Director Ford, with his broad human touches, has made him intensely human.

Others in the cast are Margaret Livingston, David Butler, Ralph Sipperly, Harry Tombrink, Lew Short, Jerry Madden and others.

"Eve's Leaves" Opens 2-Day Run At Sherrys

William Boyd, Cecil B. De Mille's popular protegee, was chosen as Leticia Joy's new leading man, and he appears opposite this winsome star in "Eve's Leaves," which comes to the Sherry theatre today for a two-day run. This followed his return to Culver City after his marriage with Ethel Fair, Cecil B. De Mille's charming leading woman.

Typically American in appearance, with light-brown hair, Boyd makes a splendid foil for the dark-haired Leticia, and the two provide an entertaining combination. Boyd's rise to leading parts was made under the careful tutelage of Mr. De Mille, who coached him as an "extra" through several picture giving him an occasional small part.

With the opening of the production of "The Road to Yesterday," Mr. De Mille decided that Boyd was ready for something big, and he made a real success in the part assigned to him. A lead in "Steel, Preferred," followed, and then he played the title role in "The Volga Boatman," under Mr. De Mille's direction—a part considered one of the greatest Hollywood has thus far provided any screen player.

"Eve's Leaves," which has China for a setting, was written by Eimer Harris and directed by Paul Sloane. The story, it is said, affords both Miss Joy and Mr. Boyd with ample opportunities for the display of their artistry. Miss Joy is seen as a tomboy daughter of a schooner captain, with a romantic turn of mind. Mr. Boyd is the son of a rich man who turns out to be a regular he-man when fate throws him and the girl he loves into the clutches of a Chinese bandit chief, played by Walter Long.

Robert Edeson and Arthur Hoyt have strong parts in the production, and the cast as a whole is said to be exceptionally clever.
