Threat Letters Will Be Traced By U.S. Officials

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 11 (AP)—United States postal inspectors have instituted a search for authors of scores of threatening letters said to have been sent to outstanding figures in the investigation, hearing and other phases of the Alvin Karpis-McPherson case. The evangelist and her mother, Mrs. Minnie Kennedy, and Mrs. Lorraine Wiseman-Schiff are awaiting trial charged with criminal conspiracy for alleged attempts to make good Mrs. McPherson's kidnapping story.

Letters containing threats ranging from destruction of property to death were in the hands of the federal authorities. These were addressed to District Attorney Amos Keyes, Judge Samuel R. Blake, who presided at the preliminary hearing, superior Judge Carlos M. Hardy, friend of the evangelist, and witnesses for the defense, deputy district attorneys E. J. Denison and Forrest Murray, assistant prosecutors; Rev. Robert Methodist church, a prominent critic of Mrs. McPherson and her work, and the evangelist herself.

JERE S. LILLIS PASSES ON IN KANSAS CITY

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Nov. 10 (AP)—Jere S. Lillis, 63, retired banker and clubman, who attracted nation-wide attention in March, 1910, when he was bound and slashed by the late Jack P. Cudahy, son of Michael Cudahy millionaire Chicago packer, is dead here.

At the time of the attack Lillis was president of the western exchange bank here. He was a bachelor. He moved in the same social circle as the Jack Cudahys. Lillis and Cudahy were warm friends. Returning to the Cudahy home unexpectedly the packers son found his wife, Mrs. Edna C. Cudahy, with Lillis.

Cudahy was accompanied by his chauffeur. The pair bound Lillis with a clothes line. Then Cudahy slashed Lillis with a knife, inflicting wounds on his face, back, arms and legs. There was no prosecution. The "Cudahy case" received wide publicity.

Later the Cudahys moved to California, where Jack shot and killed himself in Los Angeles in April, 1921, following ill health and financial troubles.

Will Spend \$3,000 On Playground

OREGON CITY, Ore.—Three thousand dollars were added Monday night to the taxes of the Oregon City school district through the action of a delegation from Mount Pleasant, who sanctioned that expenditure for grounds and equipment for the Mount Pleasant school. The district budget as published was approved. School taxes collectible in 1927 will be increased \$4542, representing an additional special levy of about one and one-quarter mills. The total special tax voted Monday night amounts to \$60,888.

Wenatchee Bonds Are Voted Down

WENATCHEE, Wash.—The proposition to issue \$55,000 in bonds to erect a new fire station and to add a fire hose and ladder equipment to the city department failed to carry in Tuesday's election. The vote was 1247 for and 1118 against, 236 votes short of the necessary amount. While the vote showed a majority of 131 votes, according to the law the special ballot needed a ratio of five to three to carry. All precincts within the business district showed a majority in favor, while outlying precincts carried majorities against it.
