Britt-Taylor Go To Be Featured On Nov. 23 Card

Taylor has never lost a decision during his career, according to lore, received by legions here, and has fought several main events in Portland, Seattle, Spokane and elsewhere.

HUSKIES PLAYING CARDINALS TODAY

Win by Stanford Will Practically Cinch the Conference Title

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 12 (AP)—Eyes of far western football fans turned today to Palo Alto, where the cardinals of the Stanford university meet the Huskies of the University of Washington in what has developed into a pivotal game of the Pacific coast conference.

A win by Stanford would carry it to within reach of the conference title, the weak University of California eleven being its only remaining opponent in the conference.

A defeat would place it on a level with four other schools that have lost one game. Despite the fact that the Cardinals are strong favorites to win, the Huskies declared that they are out to repeat last year's victory.

A second conference contest at Pullman, Wash., between the University of Oregon and Washington State college, and an inter-sectional clash between the University of Arizona and Occidental college at Los Angeles, are other features of the day's gridiron program.

The Wolf pack of the University of Nevada attempts at Berkeley to be the sixth squad to down the University of California this season.

PULLMAN, Wash., Nov. 13 (AP)—With three consecutive conference victories to their credit the Washington State college Cougars face the University of Oregon on a gridiron of mud in their homecoming game today.

Following an early season loss over Montana, Idaho and Washington have made the Cougars slight favorites. Coach Babe Hollingberry of Washington state, has predicted a hard game and declared "it will be not anybody's game until the final whistle blows."

Final Squads

Rain for two days has made the field soggy and even with fair weather in prospect a muddy field is certain. Today's game is the fourteenth between the Cougars and Oregon. The state college won six, lost four, and tied three of the previous games.

MRS. HALL CALM AS TRIAL DRAGS

Two Contrasting Pictures of Woman Defendant Given Court

SOMERVILLE, N. J. Nov. 13 (AP)—Two sharply contrasting pictures of Mrs. Frances Stevens Hall have been drawn in the courtroom where she and her brothers, Henry and Willie Stevens, are being tried for murder.

One picture, by a former maid in her home, shows her sitting alone in the library of her big home quietly playing solitaire at the time her husband, the Rev. Edward W. Hall, was slain more than four years ago with Mrs. Eleanor H. Mills, chair singer in his church.

The other picture, drawn by Alexander Simpson, special prosecutor, shows her as an implacable and steel-nerved woman driven to a murderous frenzy by hate and jealousy, and capable of going on a dark night to a deserted farm outside New Brunswick and there witnessing, if not actually participating in, the murder of her husband and the woman with whom he had a love affair. The prosecutor again and again has referred to the fact that Mrs. Mills' throat was slashed after she was shot three times in the head, and he has stressed his contention that her throat and larynx—the singing organs—were "torn out."

Defendant calm
 The matronly-looking woman who is on trial for her life has shown no sign of flinching under the lashes of the prosecutor. For eight days of the trial she has shown the same calmness. Dressed in black, her pale face untouched by any trace of rouge, she sits

quietly between her two brothers. Introduction of the clothing worn by her husband on the night he was slain, the use of a wax figure representing a human head to illustrate wounds found on the slain couple, the brandishing of a razor by a witness in illustrating how Mrs. Mills' throat might have been cut—all have failed to break down her self-control.

To Investigate Garibaldi, Macia

PARIS, Nov. 13. (AP)—A judicial investigation into the activities of Rieclott Garibaldi and Colonel Francisco Macia in the recently discovered Catalan plot has been ordered by Minister of Justice Louis Barthou.

The minister of justice has directed that the investigation be centered about charges that ammunition was stored and arms and explosives distributed by the alleged Catalan conspirators.

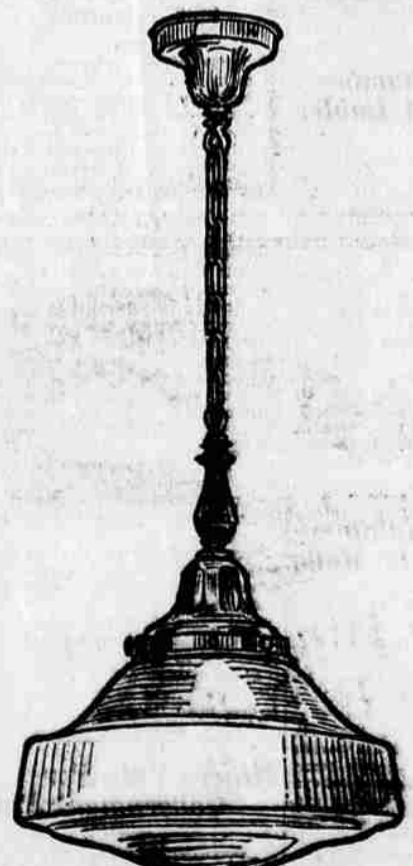
