WHAT'LL THE SENATE DO?

With a bare republican majority of one in the United States Senate, as a result of the recent elections, members of that dignified and deliberate body are faced with a problem that will take all the deliberating they possess when the 70th Congress gets in session. The problem is what do with Vare of Pennsylvania and Smith of Illinois, both of whom have gained much ill fame because of slush funds in the primary.

As a matter of politics the staunch republicans of the senate will probably seek every possible excuse for keeping Vare and Smith. But there is a growing number whose minds have revolted against such apparent political scandal and whose energies are going to be thrown against the seating of these men from the start. Borah has announced his determination to fight them; Norris, of Nebraska, is already up in arms on the subject. And there are numerous insurgents—Brookhart of Iowa, Nye of North Dakota, Blaine of Wisconsin—who from policy and instinct will oppose anyone who has so completely outclassed the shades of Newberry.

Vare's record is a particular thorn in the side of honest citizenry. His lavish expenditures in the primary were enough to cause doubt, but the returns from many precincts in his home town of Philadelphia—ruled by Vare's own machine—are enough to make one approach the thing only when equipped with a clothes pin for the nostrils. In an editorial in the New York World we read this:

"On the basis of these returns Philadelphia is invited to believe, and the rest of the country is invited to believe, that in twenty-nine election divisions not one vote was cast for Vare's opponent; that in these twenty-nine divisions there was not a single personal enemy of Vare, a single dissatisfied republican voter, a single protest vote against Vare's campaign expenditures, a single dry vote cast against Vare's vetness; that although the constitution of Pennsylvania requires minority party representation at the polls, and although under this provision there would be at least two legitimate registrars in every voting division, on Tuesday of last week, these democratic registrars were in every single instance dead or missing, or else won by Vare."

Such a thing taxes the imagination, but it's true. Is it my wonder that righteous senators, republicans and democrats alike, are waiting their chance to uncover the indicated "fifth"? Elections of that kind do not "just happen" in America. And anyone responsible for them, or benefiting by them, cannot properly qualify for membership in the nation's highest legislative tribunal.

PRICE OF TURKEY PUZZLES MARKET

Forty Cents May Be Top Quotation—Crop of Birds Is Fair

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 16 (AP)—With Thanksgiving just a little more than a week off, predictions of the price that will rule for the holiday are heard on every side. Some are bullish. Others are conservative, with 40c as the general top, the most popular idea.

One thing is generally admitted. There is a fairly good turkey crop in the producing sections contributing to the Portland market. It may not be a bumper crop but growers concede that there is little likelihood of a shortage. Quality is excellent with the flocks well conditioned. This may mean that they will all be marketed at Thanksgiving, prices being right. Otherwise only the prime birds would be shipped for the Thanksgiving trade and the others held over until the Xmas holidays for further conditioning. Actual number of birds that will be available for this market is also hard to estimate. The Idaho and Roseburg crops, two of the biggest lots in the northwest, may go south to San Francisco or be shipped east and never see this market.

Market Dragging

Today the wholesale market is dragging a bit. Receipts are plentiful and so far the demand is limited to the regular trade with few of the retailers taking on their Thanksgiving requirements. Prices today on fancy dressed turkeys range from 35c on small sizes to as high as 41 and 42c for birds weighing 12 pounds and up.

Other lines of poultry are generally steady and unchanged. Extra grades of poultry are generally steady and unchanged.

Extra grades of cube butter are lower today with prices on the exchange off 1 1/2c at 41 1/2c top. Other grades held steady.

Fresh eggs are weak and lower with extra and current receipts off a cent on the daily exchange at 43 and 41c respectively. Other grades held steady and unchanged.

TURKEY BUYING TO BEGIN

ROSEBURG, Ore., Nov. 16 (AP)—Turkey buying for the Thanksgiving market starts this week in the Umpqua valley. Buyers who are shipping long distances will start buying Thursday, while birds for nearer markets will come in the last of the week. Although the Umpqua valley has a fairly large crop of turkeys this year, indications are that there will be few of them offered for the Thanksgiving trade. Instead of fattening their fowls at this time many growers plan to hold the birds until the holiday season and fatten them all at the same time, taking advantage of the extra poundage at that time.

So far there have been no plans for a turkey pool. For several years the growers tried pooling, but recently they have returned to the individual buying system. Local buyers, representing outside firms, are now advertising for turkeys but are making no price quotations. All buying up to date has been at 44c, but if the offerings are short the price will probably advance so that the buyers may secure enough to cover orders.

TANNERY CREW AGAIN ACTIVE; MARKETS GOOD

DALLAS, Ore., Nov. 16—For the first time in six years the leather market is in excellent condition and the local tannery is working at top speed and has more orders than it can fill, according to A. B. Moir, of the Muir & McDonald tannery, pioneer Dallas concern.

The market has been improving steadily for the past three months after six years of depression. Mr. Moir says: "The product of the tannery goes largely to the middle west and California where it is used in the manufacture of saddles, collars, etc. Another market that takes considerable high grade leather is that of the manufacture of fancy leather belts. This requires a thin, uniform leather tanned from the skins of two-year-old cattle."

Aside from the indication of development of normal business conditions, the leather market forecasts the return of the horse on the farm. The displacing of teams by farm tractors slumped the harness business greatly several years ago, and there was practically no demand for harness leather.

The leather belt business indicates that the leather men are winning back some of the ground they lost with the development of leather substitutes and composition products.

This hides used by the local tannery come chiefly from Polk and Marion counties.
