POULTRY SUPPLY NOW PLENTIFUL

Prices of Fowls Are Unchanged Excepting Heavy Hens

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 24 (AP).—Poultry of all kinds—chickens, ducks, geese and other fowl—were in plentiful supply and at unchanged prices except that heavy hens which dropped a cent a pound to 25c this morning.

Eggs were firm with all grades quotably unchanged except peewees, which advanced a cent. Butter generally steady. Receipts of turkeys in the Portland wholesale market moved out yesterday to retailers and large consumers as rapidly as brought in from producers. This morning's arrivals were in large volume. Distribution was slower than on previous days, although many orders were filled during the morning.

As a result of heavy late arrivals and the stocking of retail markets to probably near the limit, the price of top turkey gobblers weakened a cent a pound from Tuesday's high price of 45c a pound. This morning's price to the trade was at 44c for extreme top, with indications that during the day this price might be shaded.

Choice turkeys not grading up to fancy quality are obtainable in the local wholesale market at as low as 32c a pound.

Wheat Up After Early Declines

CHICAGO, Nov. 24 (AP).—Opening wheat prices 1/2c off to 1/4c up, were followed by a moderate general decline and then by an upturn to well-above yesterday's finish. Corn, oats and provisions likewise developed firmness, corn starting at 1/2c decline to 1/4c advance and subsequently showing gains all around.

Wheat closed firm 1/4 to 1/2c net higher; corn 1/2 to 3/4c up; oats 1/4 to 3/4c gain and provisions unchanged to a rise of 25c.

buy the Harris ranch adjoining, he said, but did not have the money, and suggested that Meizan advance \$125,000 to buy the property, he and Fall to form a stock company for the ranches. Fall placed the value of his own holdings at \$200,000.

Tells of Ranch Deal.
Almost at the outset of his prosecution today, the government struck into the question of the ultimate disposition of the \$100,000 advanced the former cabinet member by Doheny before the latter's company was awarded the Elk Hills oil lease. Will Ed. Harris, one of the owners of the ranch adjoining Fall's at Three Rivers, N. M., testified that the Harris ranch was bought by Fall early in December, 1921, Fall paying \$10,000 in cash to bind the bargain.

Price Movement Continues Upward

NEW YORK, Nov. 24 (By the Associated Press).—The main price movement in today's stock market continued upward despite the usual pre-holiday profit taking and a selling attack on issues with large Mexican property holdings, based on the dispute over Mexican land laws. Baldwin, which was under pressure during the morning, rallied about 5 points from its low to 151, the highest price in several years. United States Steel common and General Motors also pointed upward after an early interval of heaviness.

Baking, shipping, motion picture, equipment, oil and farm implement shares also showed several points of strength. Commercial Solvents "B" which soared 11 points yesterday, fell from 235 to 224 and Cuyamel Fruit broke 5 points to a new low.
