

ARMY FLYERS TO TOUR THE SOUTH

Ten Airmen to Visit South America, Central America, West Indies

SAN ANTONIO, Dec. 17. (AP)—Ten airmen who have been selected to tour the South American, Central American and West Indies, will leave for the trip in a few days.

The airmen, who are being sent to the various countries to promote the army air service, will be in charge of all flying instruction at Kelly field. He was originally in the infantry but was transferred to the Air Service and started to study aviation while in the army of occupation.

He will pilot the "New York," flagship of the expedition with Lieutenant Francis C. Whitehead as pilot. Lieutenant Whitehead, head, born in Kansas and graduated from the University of Kansas, has had extensive engineering training and signal corps work.
