## EGG PRICES GO DOWN; TURKS 45c

Butter Market Firm with Prime Firsts a Cent Higher Today

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 23 (AP).—Fresh eggs values are again weak and lower in the local market. Extras are down a cent to 40 cents on the exchange and poultry one cent lower at 35 cents. Under-sized stock declined 2 cents to 30 cents.

Receipts Wednesday were heavy at 332 cases and only 132 cases came out of the coolers.

Butter market continues firm with prime firsts cubes a cent higher on the exchange at 45 cents. Other grades were unchanged. Demand for butter is keen with 35 cents being paid in zone one and 31 cents at the stations. Butterfat delivered Portland is generally bringing 54 cents.

The turkey market has settled around 45 cents and stocks are cleaning up at that price. The street was practically bare of fancy birds Thursday morning and readily sold at 45 to 47 cents. Good birds but slightly bruised in shipment are going at 42 to 44 cents.

CHICAGO, Dec. 23 (By the Associated Press).—Opening at 1/4c off to 1/2c up, wheat soon scored a slight general advance. Corn, oats and provisions were easier, corn starting unchanged to 1/4c higher, but then undergoing a sag.

Wheat closed weak, unchanged to 1/4c net lower; corn 3/4c to 1/2c off; oats 1/4c to 1/2c down and provisions unchanged to rise of 1/2c.

**TRAIN ROBBERS**  
FACE 177 YEARS

Four Convicted by Jury in Cheyenne of Union Pacific Charges

CHEYENNE, Wyo., Dec. 23 (AP).—Possible sentences of 177 years each in federal prison face four of the seven defendants convicted last night in the United States district court here of the robbery of a Union Pacific mail train near Rock Springs last August, in which they obtained lost in bonds, currency and unsigned currency valued at \$220,000. They are: Jack Madison, mail clerk on the train; Jack Keene, conductor; E. Barnett and John Kammariotis, all convicted on all 11 counts in the indictment.

Of their companions, Theodore (Ted) Theodore and Paul Suris were convicted on six of the 11 counts, and Edna Nagley, the woman in the case, was convicted only on the conspiracy charge in the indictment.

The first five counts, consisting of robbery of the mail by placing the life of the mail clerk in jeopardy by the use of firearms, carry sentences of 25 years flat. The next five counts—robbery of the mail with the jeopardy clause eliminated—are punishable with sentences of from one to 10 years each. The last count of conspiracy carries a maximum sentence of two years.

Court attaches said that sentence will not be pronounced until some time after Christmas, Judge T. Blake Kennedy having detained counsel 19 days in which to file motion for a new trial.

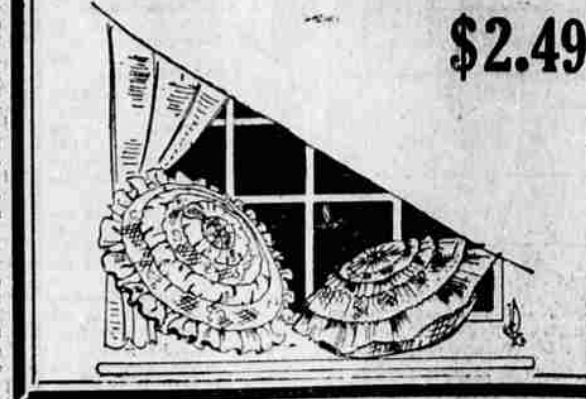
