The United States civil service commission has announced an examination to be held at La Grande, Ore., as a result of which it is expected to make certification to fill a contemplated vacancy in the position of fourth-class postmaster at Island City, Ore., and other vacancies as they may occur at that office, unless it shall be decided in the interest of the service to fill any vacancy by re-statement. The compensation of the postmaster at this office was \$611 for the last fiscal year. Receipt of applications will close Jan. 26, 1939.

Proving itself delightful in every respect, Rod La Rocque's new star picture, "Gigolo," created a fine impression on its first presentation in La Grande at the Sherry theater yesterday. This is a screen version of Edna Ferber's story of the French war heroes who are known as "gigolos," or dancing partners of wealthy women who frequent Parisian cafes.
