Warns Political Parties to Keep From 'Meddling'

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7 (AP)—With a warning to all political parties that their death knell will be sounded "if they fool with this question of law enforcement," members of the citizens committee of one thousand, composed of prominent men and women, set out today to launch a vigorous educational campaign on the law observance and enforcement throughout the land.

As their watchword, the committee members had a message from President Coolidge, declaring that if public laws fail to be enforced, "government itself fails," and if it fails to be observed, "the very foundation on which self-government rests is weakened and destroyed."

Senators Speak
The message was read before the committee's annual meeting here last night at which Senators Borah, republican, Idaho, and Sheppard, democrat, Texas, and Raymond, republican, Chicago, in addresses punctuated with cheers and handclapping raised the danger signal to those who would "nullify" and "trample" the constitution.

The committee adopted a resolution which stands on law enforcement as outlined in his message to congress and calling upon the people to "elect and support such officials" in order "to insure our national well-being."

The president, unable to attend the meeting because of the "press of official business," said in his message that he regarded the observance and enforcement of the law as "exceedingly important to the public welfare of the nation," that "it is scarcely too much to say that all our rights, our liberty, and life itself, are dependent for their protection on public law," and that "any thing that your organization can do to impress this principle on the public mind will be a distinct public service."

TWIN FALLS, Ida., Jan. 7 (AP)—Hard boiled sheepmen grieve to see fair women's limbs exposed—not for modesty's sake, but because shapely silk knees, unshielded from the cold blast, are had for the wool business. It was explained by T. C. Bacon, president of the Idaho Wool Growers' association.

Transfer of eight officials of the U. S. forest service is announced by District Forester C. M. Granger. Forest Supervisor Lawrence R. Parker is transferred, effective about Feb. 15, from the Colville national forest, Republic, Wash., to the superintendency of the Mount Baker national forest, Bellingham. Supervisor C. R. Park, the present incumbent at Bellingham, will be assigned to important government timber sale work on the Olympic national forest. Assistant Supervisor Robert L. Campbell, of the Mount Baker forest, will be transferred to the Timpqua national forest, Roseburg, Ore., effective Feb. 1.

Parker's place on the Colville forest will be filled by the promotion and transfer of Assistant Supervisor P. A. Thompson, now on the Whitman forest, Baker, Ore., effective Feb. 1. Grazing Examiner J. L. Peterson will be transferred on Jan. 15 from the district forester's office at Portland to the Whitman forest.

A. H. Wright, forest supervisor of the Sixtynine forest, Grants Pass, Ore., will be detailed on Jan. 15 to Phoenix, Ariz., for a few months. His place at Grants Pass will be filled by the transfer and promotion to forest supervisor of Assistant Supervisor James H. Billingslea, now of the Olympic forest, Washington. Billingslea's place at Olympia will be taken by Forest Ranger J. R. Bruchart of the Snoqualmie forest, Seattle, Wash., who is promoted to assistant supervisor of the Olympic forest.

Indian Uses Own Method Of Divorce

THE DALLES, Ore., Jan. 7.—Tommy Thompson, chief of the Colville Indians, in the county jail facing a technical bigamy charge preferred against him by wife No. 1, while officers of the sheriff's force marveled at the iron constitution of the aborigine.

The chief was taken into custody recently from his sweat-house on the banks of the Celilo canal a short distance west of the falls by Sheriff Levi Christman and Deputy George Scherrer, who located the tribe's chief executive after considerable difficulty.

After hearing the sweat-house, a sod hut in which Indians take steam baths to cure what ails them, Thompson was called and came forth, attired in his birthday clothing. After learning what was wanted of him, the native walked to the canal, splashed icy water over his body and proceeded leisurely to dress while officers stamped their feet and swung their arms to keep warm. He was then brought to jail.

According to the complaint, the car of the fishermen had fired off wife No. 1 and had forced her departure and taken into himself wife No. 2. This is a common occurrence among the natives, and might have passed without further comment, but it happened that wife No. 1 had advanced the cash to purchase the house in which Chief Thompson was residing with wife No. 2. She did not mind losing her husband, she indicated, but she balked at furnishing him with a house for her successful rival.

The matter will be threshed out in the local courts.
