LULL SEASON AT HAND IN MARKET

Receipts of Ducks and Geese Picking Up in Portland, However

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 14 (AP)—With the lull season at hand that always follows the holiday receipts of ducks and geese are picking up but there is little or no demand for these kinds of poultry now. During the holiday rich ducks were scarce and dealers were appealing to the growers to ship their birds, but arrivals were light. Now with the demand gone the ducks are common. Today's receipts are not moving and too few sales were made to establish a price level.

No change is shown in country dressed geese. Friday's arrivals were light and prices held around 17 cents on hogs and 17 1/2 cents on veal.

Eggs grade eggs are a cent higher at 22 cents. Other grades remained steady and unchanged. Standard cases are a fraction higher in the local butter market, being posted at 44 cents on the exchange. Other grades remained steady at former levels.

Stock Exchange In Sinking Spell With Many Drops

NEW YORK, Jan. 14 (AP)—The stock market experiences a sinking spell this afternoon when call money was marked up from 4 to 4 1/2 per cent. The higher rate followed the calling of about \$15,000,000 in loans, but was generally regarded as temporary. Early declines ran from 1 to 5 points on selling which appeared to be largely of professional origin and presumably inspired, in part, by the failure of operators for the rise to attract a public figure.

Erratic fluctuations continued in Commercial Solvents B, which sold down to 24 1/2 after having established a record high at 25 1/2 yesterday. U. S. Cast Iron Pipe sold down four points, Southern Railway B, and Southern Railway C, and Woolworth-Kinney Company, Cash Threshing, Atlantic Coast Line and several others two points or more.

The market steadied during the fourth hour when recoveries in several issues ran from one to two points. Tobacco products were in brisk demand during the afternoon.

The closing was irregular. Lehigh Valley soared 1 1/2 to 121 1/2, a new record price, and Wheeling and Lake Erie preferred also made a new top at 54 1/2. Total sales approximated 1,300,000 shares.

Wool Report
BOSTON, Mass., Jan. 14 (AP)—The Commercial Bulletin tomorrow will say: "The wool market has been more active this week, and prices are very firm throughout the list. There have been some sizeable sales of territory wool at fully firm prices."

"The foreign markets are very buoyant and have shown a rising tendency in all primary centers. Australia being up a cent a pound in the greasy, with River Plate markets a half cent to a cent lower. The European secondary markets are firm and look for a strong market at London opening Tuesday."

"The manufacturing situation appears to be very sound and demand is continuing better than usual for the time of year."

"Stocks of wool as tabulated for the Boston wool trade association as of January 5 aggregated 81,419,502 pounds, of which 54,642,342 pounds were domestic. A year ago the total was 82,241,811 pounds of which 24,442,400 pounds were domestic."

"Mohair is moderately active with some business on good Texas at 62 cents in the original bales. The Commercial Bulletin will publish the following quotations tomorrow:

The trip was being undertaken in the hope that Feyerabend could show just where he had separated from Brownlee.

Early Saturday morning a party of "Crag-rats" under the direction of "Andy" Anderson and Paul Hoerlein will start out on a two-day search of the country east of white river, working on the theory that Brownlee might have crossed the white river glacier and wandered to the east and north hunting for a government camp.
