(AP)—The rebellion of the Yaqui Indians in the state of Sonora is reported by the war department to have entered its final phase, the Yaqui chiefs announcing a desire to surrender. They claim they were deceived by Adolfo de la Huerta, and will deliver up their arms and devote themselves to agricultural activities henceforth.
